One in five people in the US have an STI*

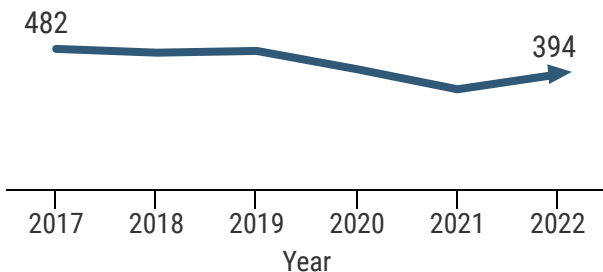
Many STIs go undiagnosed because people may not develop symptoms right away or do not notice their symptoms. Individuals of all races, ethnicities and genders are impacted by STIs.



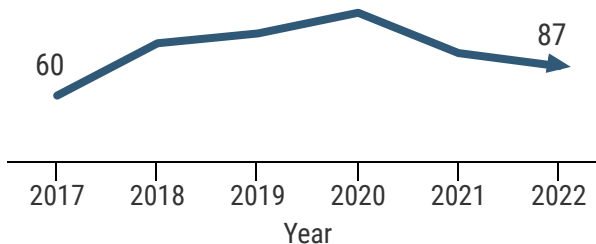
Sexually transmitted infections are serious when left untreated:

- Untreated chlamydia can lead to pelvic inflammatory disease and infertility in women.*
- Untreated gonorrhea can lead to pelvic inflammatory disease, infertility in men and women, and life threatening blood infection.*
- Untreated syphilis can lead to neurological complications and death. Pregnant individuals can pass infection to their unborn baby.*

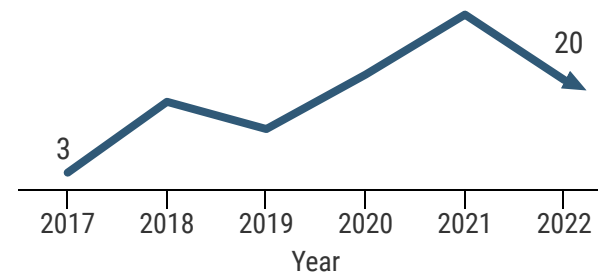
Chlamydia cases



Gonorrhea cases

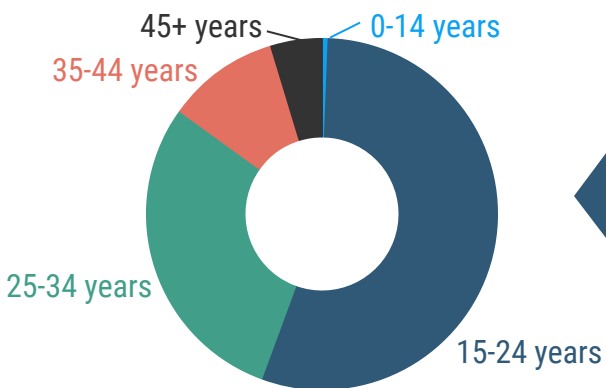


Syphilis cases



Prevent the spread of STIs with a few simple steps: **Talk. Test. Treat.**

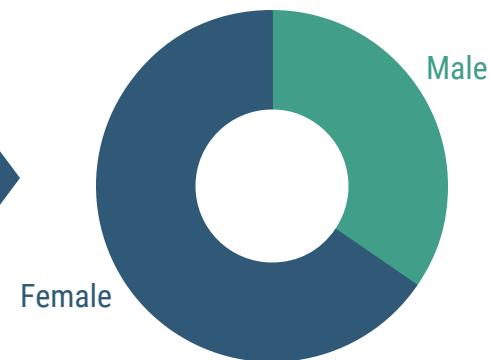
Have fewer partners • Talk to your partners about the risks • Use condoms • Get tested regularly • Make sure you get treated if you or your partner tests positive. Local test sites are listed on the back of this page!



From 2017-2022 in Skagit County:

15-34 year-olds accounted for 84% of all chlamydia, gonorrhea and syphilis cases.

Those who identify as female accounted for 65% of all chlamydia, gonorrhea and syphilis cases.

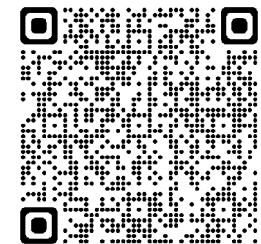
