ADOPTION OF MARINE RECOVERY AREAS FOR ON SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS

Whereas the Skagit County Board of Health has the authority to enact local rules and regulations necessary to preserve, promote and improve the public health pursuant to RCW 70.05.060, and

Whereas Washington State Board of Health adopted Chapter 246-272A WAC, *On-site Sewage Systems*, July 13, 2005, becoming fully effective July 1, 2007; and

Whereas WAC 246-272A-0015 requires that all 12 Puget Sound Counties, including Skagit County, develop a management plan regarding development and management activities for all on-site sewage systems (OSS) within the jurisdiction; and

Whereas RCW 70.118A.030, *Marine Recovery Areas* goes on to require that all Puget Sound Counties, including Skagit, propose Marine Recovery Areas; and

Whereas Chapter 12.05 Skagit County Code (SCC) governing on-site sewage systems (OSS) was revised in 2007 to adopt the above changes in WAC 246-272A and RCW 70.118A; and

Whereas on January 22, 2007, by Resolution #R20070034, the Skagit County Board of Health appointed a Citizens' Advisory Committee to assist the Skagit County Health Department staff in revising SCC 12.05 and developing the On site Sewage Management Plan, which included proposed Marine Recovery and Sensitive Areas; and

Whereas the Skagit County Board of Health considered the public testimony and adopted the On Site Sewage Management Plan, on October 9, 2007; and

Whereas, the Skagit County Public Health Department held eight public meetings and open houses at multiple locations from January through July 2008 regarding establishing the boundaries and requirements of Marine Recovery Areas and Sensitive Areas as outlined in the Skagit County On Site Sewage Management Plan, and

Whereas the boundaries of the Bay View area were extended beyond the rural village noted in the On Site Sewage Management Plan to include Bay View Hill and the Joe Leary Slough watershed as a result of comments received by the Health Department (Attachment D); and

Whereas notification of the public hearing was published in the Skagit Valley Herald on July 24 and July 31, 2008; and

Whereas the Board of Health extended the comment period to August 22, 2008; and

Whereas the Skagit County Board of Health has considered additional public testimony regarding Marine Recovery Areas and Sensitive Areas, and

Whereas, based upon additional public testimony, the Board of Health believes it is warranted to change Colony Creek and the Lower Samish River Watershed from Sensitive Areas to Marine Recovery Areas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

The Board of Health adopts Marine Recovery Areas as identified in the Skagit County On Site Sewage Management Plan and as amended from citizen comments as follows:

- Samish Island and Samish Bay (Attachment A)
- Yokeko, Dewey Beach and Quiet Cove (Attachment B)
- Similk Bay and Similk Beach Community (Attachment C)
- Padilla Bay and Bay View Rural Village (Attachment D)
- Guemes Island (Attachment E)
- Colony Creek (Attachment F)
- Lower Samish River Basin (Attachment G)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Board of Health adopts sensitive areas impacting Marine Recovery Areas due to water quality impairments and large numbers of unknown on site sewage systems as follows:

- Upper Samish River Basin (Attachment H)
- Thomas Creek Basin (Attachment I)
- Nookachamps Creek Basin (Attachment J)
