

# Rebate Program

## *What is it?*

\$100 rebate for septic system inspections AND \$100 rebate for installation of risers and lids. Funded by an EPA grant through the Washington State Department of Health.

## *Is it for certain places?*

Marine Recovery Areas, Sensitive Areas or near fresh or marine water shorelines primarily, but check with Skagit County Public Health for eligibility.

## *Why would I need it?*

Regular inspections help prevent septic system failures. Risers and lids make the septic system easier to inspect later. That means protecting public health and improving water quality for everyone.

### The small print- CONDITIONS

- Only one rebate per inspection.
- One rebate for riser/lid installation.

### UP to \$200

- Rebate for work done only after October 1, 2011.
- Rebate program ends October 1, 2014
- Rebates not allowed for septic tank pumping.
- Owner occupied private residences only.
- Sorry, but previous inspection rebate recipients are not eligible to receive a second one. Same deal for riser and lid installation rebates.

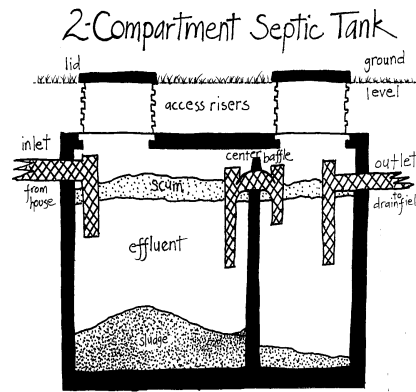
# How it works

## To qualify and receive your rebate you must:

1. Own a private residence in Skagit County.
2. Live in an area of water quality concern like the Samish River Watershed, a Marine Recovery Area or Sensitive Area. Other areas may be eligible — just ask.
3. Attend a **free** Septics 101 Clinic in Skagit County OR View the on-line training at [www.skagitcounty.net/septics101](http://www.skagitcounty.net/septics101) online. **NEW!**
4. Have the inspection and/or installation done by a Skagit County certified operations and maintenance provider (list available online or call the Health Department).
5. Pay for the services. Keep your receipt or paid invoice.
6. Submit the application with documentation of the work done to the Health Dept.

**You will receive the rebate in approximately one month.**
