RE: 2019 Permit Categories and Fees

On January 29, 2019 the Skagit County Board of Health approved a revised Schedule of Charges to take effect June 1, 2019. Food establishments were notified of the proposed changes and provided opportunity to comment in January 2019. The table below provides an overview of changes to food establishment permit categories and fees from the current Food Safety Program Schedule of Charges that was last revised in 2013.
