HOW DO I FIND A PROVIDER?

Talk to your doctor.

- Your primary care physician may be able to talk to you about treatment options and provide referrals or recommendations.

Find a provider in your network.

- Most insurance websites have lists of providers in their networks. You can also call your insurance company.
- Check psychologytoday.com and search for providers in your area. Then filter by insurance plan, language, concern, and more.
- If you're having difficulty finding a provider to match your availability, consider looking for a provider who offers telehealth appointments.

Verify insurance coverage.

- No matter how you find a provider, **always** call the provider's office to confirm that they take your specific insurance plan. Databases and lists are often out of date.

Get on cancellation lists.

- Most behavioral health providers have wait times of several weeks to months. Getting on cancellation lists with a few providers may reduce the time it takes to be seen. Make sure to cancel any scheduled appointments with other providers after you have been seen.

Ask about Employee Assistance Plans.

- If you are having trouble finding a provider who can see you soon, ask your human resources or benefits department if your employer has an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP). EAPs help employees—and sometimes their family members—address work and life concerns.

If you're looking for a provider for your child, follow the steps above and contact their school counselor for additional support during the school day.

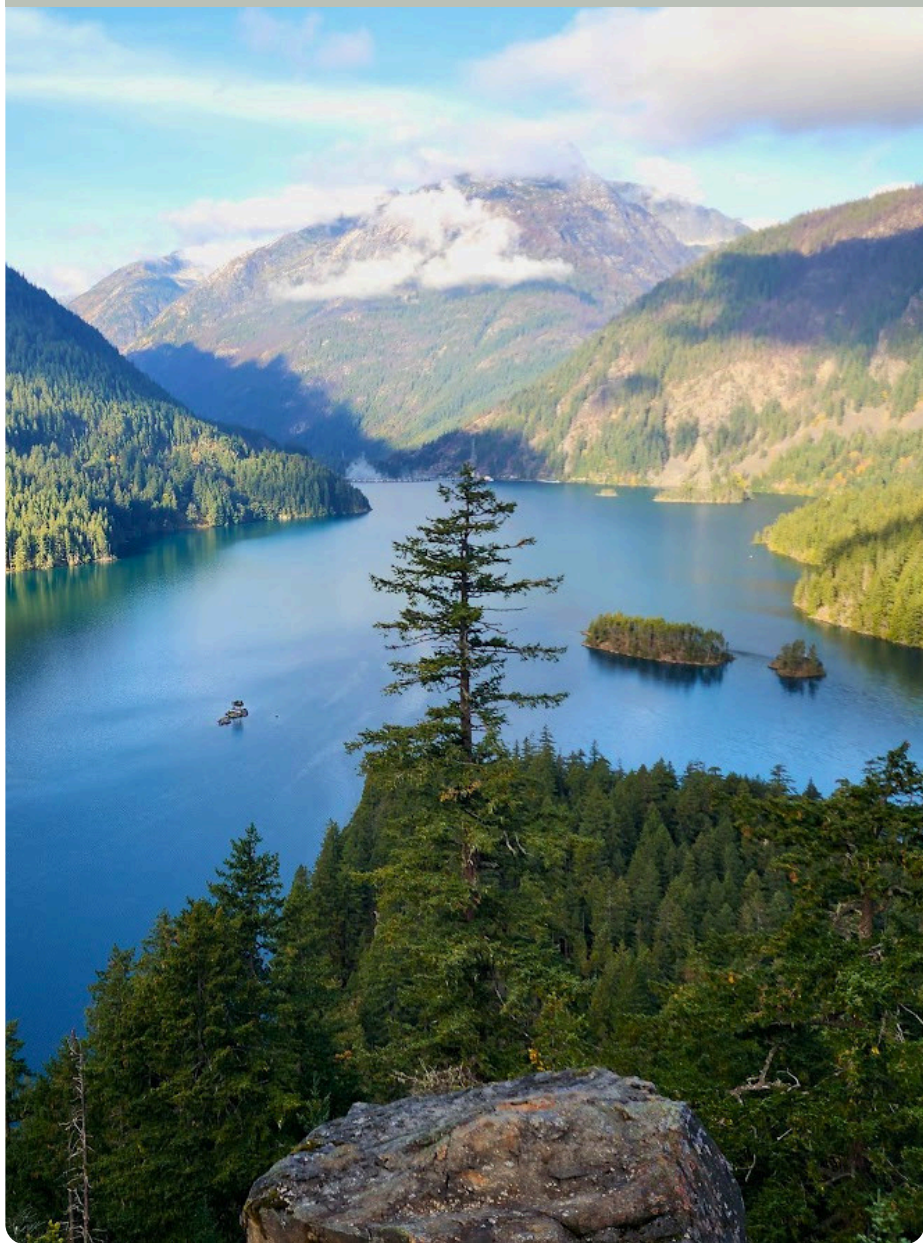

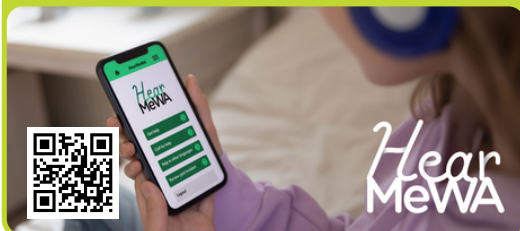

Program fees apply. Many residents receive housing assistance through therapeutic courts, recovery support programs, and other housing programs. If you cannot pay rent, R.I.S.E. staff can connect you to housing service providers for assistance.

How to request services

Fill out contact form online for intake; priority is given to participants in therapeutic courts and those with Department of Corrections involvement

Services provided

- Supportive housing and recovery skills development
- Program lasts up to 2 years
- Residents must:
 - Have a documented substance use disorder and desire for recovery
 - Participate in weekly house meetings, one-on-one meetings with staff, and urinalysis testing
 - Follow house rules, develop and follow a recovery plan
 - Increase involvement in pro-recovery activities

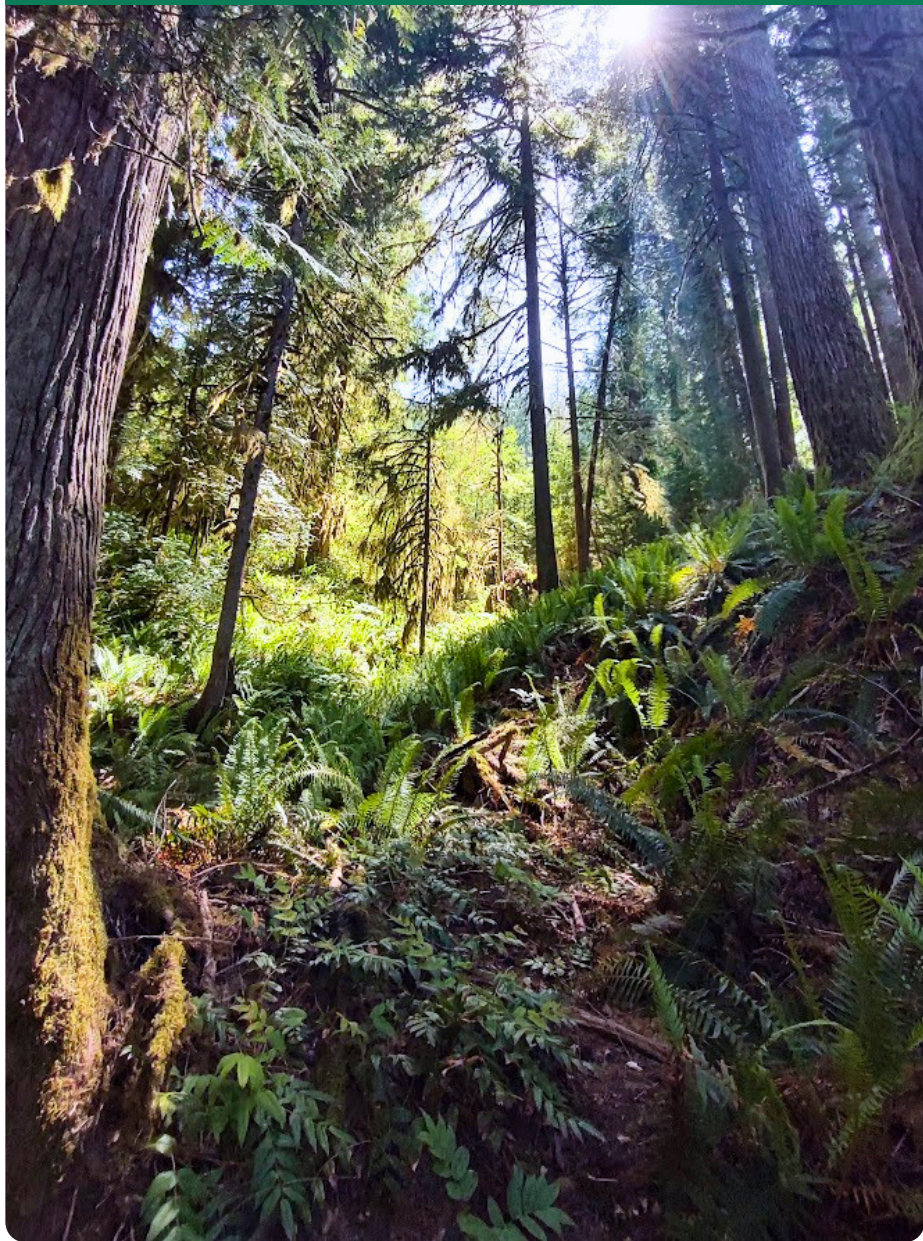
