Call to Order, Introductions

Michael Hughes called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm.

Approval of Meeting Summary

Nels Lagerlund moved to accept the May 8, 2019 summary with correction of Omdal corrected on page 3, Tim Van Hofwegen seconded. Motion carried.

Guest Speaker

Bill Blake, Skagit Conservation District

Bill attended at the request of the Board to provide an update on the District's activities and proposed fee increases.

Update Programs- Conservation Stewardship Program fees rates/changes, working with Sarah (NRCS) helping landowners with some compensation, cover crops, organic wheat. Bill provided a handout listing the changes/rates. Add \$5/ parcel proposed, handout provided for vehicles. He has been working with Ron Wesen writing it up in resolution as up to \$5, wouldn't have to be that much.

\$126,000 funds cut to \$95,000. Bill will work 4 day weeks starting in September.

Tim Van Hofwegen- What is the definition of forest?

Bill 20-40 acres; 5 acres. Kevin Zobrist-bugs & disease. SCD management plan considers slopes, soils, etc. Looking for certain types of trees that will tolerate climate change. Carbon sequestration- coniferous species (less runoff & erosion)

Terry asks why do some dairy farmers look to SCD for a plan and others don't? Nels -we have conservation plan, support them but ask questions with new tax. Taxing people you are trying to save. Beef program want to charge more and more, with beef prices down. Jeff and Terry live on non-ag land and would pay \$5 per parcel even in the city. Terry questions cant there be a maximum. Bill has filed with County Commissioners, they are holding a hearing in August/September and they can ask the Treasurer what a fair number is. Tim finances a lot of single family residential development. People buy property with trees with no idea what to do. Is there really a market for it? Bill stated, it is not a harvest plan; it helps them know what will grow well. (mutual benefits) A cultural assessment costs about \$4,000 and on-site observer another \$4,000 for a dairy farm. Conservation Commission is paying for that. Terry questioned what outreach is, who is it reaching? Horse owners, backyard wildlife, sustainable gardening, and rain garden, some work in the cities- stormwater, retention, & maintenance.

New Business

HAL HART, PDS Update

Handout- Growth Report from State OFM- 225 housing permits (from last year) tracking just like last year. Looking at Paccar expansion; 150 workers. Referrals to SCD-be a team on that. Hired Long Range Planner; Michael Cerbone (Multhomah County Director, Forester). Lisa Gruter-AG Tourism study, he will follow up with her next week. Lisa Janicki took Michael on a tour yesterday, AG tourism problem areas-doing things w/o permits. Hal stated he is more thankful for what we have here in Skagit. Terry mentioned SVH app, getting to know feature, moved here for rural character. Buy 40 acres and build house on it. Nels stated BCC talking about housing shortage. Hal- help with cities, co-ownership in cities, senior housing, & mental health housing. Teach them how to support Ag here. Steve stated incentive for cities to go higher density. Hal-preserve land base in rural areas, drive development to cities. Terry-Envision Skagit said it was not well accepted, Hal suggested breaking it down to show them what can work. Terry said-give people ways to experience ag; little opportunity to do it in a meaningful way. Steve stated that cities build up, not out-referenced to Trillium's proposal.

KARA SYMONDS, PUBLIC WORKS Update

Burlington has Agricultural Heritage Program, donate to Farmland Legacy Program. (Kara also sent her notes) - 11,500 acres in the program, 225 development rights eliminated, 25 in queue.

Conservation Futures- offer has gone down a bit, before-land value (has stayed same) after-with encumbrance of easement.

40 acre, 1 DR \$400,000 (10,000 per acre)
Used to be \$280,000
Now about \$320,000
\$80,000 day, Right (thou pay on difference) so the oil

\$80,000 dev. Right (they pay on difference; so the offer is going down). Substandard lots the offer is still more.

5 year review of all appraisals

Farm to Market poplar farm had contacted them, now working with DucksUnlimitied to create wetlands (Futures Board concerned about affecting neighbors) Nels, right across way Rasar Duck Club ponds (there is an easement. Michael stated they should stay in preserving farmland if hiring monitoring contractor.
