to what the board has done and how we address this kind of problem. I recently became a Landscape Architect and with that I have to keep up on educational credits so I figured being a part of the board would be beneficial for me as a landscaper as well as a landscape architect. I'm trying to learn, help each other out and see what is being done. I wanted to come and see what the noxious weed board was about as well as learn more about noxious weeds and gain more knowledge. Logan is interested in serving on the board for District 3.

Joseph: Our minimum board members responsibilities are to attend our quarterly meetings in January, April, July, and October. There is a noxious weed listing process in January that is very important and determines the classification of weeds in Skagit County for the following year. Another important commitment is our appeals board. If an enforcement is taken and a landowner wished to appeal the decision they will then come in front of the board for an appeal. Skagit County is in charge of the employee but I still receive guidance and advice from the board with regard to projects and overall scale and scope of work. Michael See is our Division Manager for the Natural Resource Division.

Sonny Gohrman: The Noxious Weed Control Board sets priorities for the employee, any personal issues are dealt with internally at the county but mostly the board sets the priorities for the noxious weeds in the county.

Sonny Gohrman: Nominates Victor Jenson since he has been around on the board and in the Agricultural community for a long time.

Victor Jenson: does not accept the nomination.

Joseph Shea: He is not active and his term expired. We currently have someone who is trying to apply for his board position. She just hasn't been able to get her 10 signatures filled out with the current situation. Would Sonny be interested?

Sonny: I would like to defer currently from being the chair as I don't want to create any conflicts of interest while I am still employed with WSDA.

Joseph: Would it be acceptable then if I just ran the meeting while we are meeting virtually?

Victor Jensen: My only comment would be with Joe in charge of the program we should have a board member run the meeting. Any one new can even fill the chair position just to run the meetings. Joe provides the program and we are an advisory committee. Not like anyone makes executive decisions or anything. I think anyone could work I haven't been on the board that long myself but it's not going to work for me.

Sonny: Since no one is interesting at this point I would just defer selecting a chair and have you run things. Since you're already in charge of the WebEx.

Joseph: I will go ahead and run the meetings for now to keep things running smooth but I do agree with Victor's comments to have someone other than myself run the meetings so that way I can just participate and give my reports and not be the one in charge of the flow of the meeting.

b. Noxious Weed Coordinator Report

CWMA MOU agreement.

We have received an updated draft edited by the DNR and will be getting those out to our partners for signatures. Since we have not heard anyone else suggesting any edits I will go ahead and move forward to get signatures from the different partners in the CWMA.

Sonny Gohrman: When do you start to spray your Poison Hemlock?

Joseph Shea: Typically in April sometime. This is typically when the new seedlings start to emerge and before they generate seed so they are more susceptible. Does that sound right Christie?

Christie Turner: Yeah that sounds right around the first week of April.

Sonny Gohrman: Good Timing.

Joseph Shea: The only thing is that it's harder to see at that time. I've noticed an increase in Poison Hemlock calls and now we have multiple sites that we are aware of and addressing. With Christie on board we were able to address more noxious weed concerns in the early spring season.

Once we get our full board we will be sending more enforcement letters to landowners. Currently we send various noxious weed letters to landowners but now with a full time employee I should have the appropriate amount of time to dedicate to surveying and NOVs (notice of violation). So far all of the properties I sent letters to have treated and removed the noxious weeds in question.

c. Treasurers Report

Joseph Shea: We are on par for the second quarter budget monitoring report. We're showing roughly 60% in all items and we are just entering the time of year where we have most of our expenses. The only thing that is underspent is supplies. We might get more equipment before the end of the year but we are be cautious about spending because of the potential loss of revenue at the county.

We were hoping to get Cheryl's application by next meeting to get our other two board positions filled. Logan is interested in district 2 as well. So hopefully we can fill the board before the new year. Since we have no new applications there is no new nominations.

Since the current language in SCC 9.56 is unusable it is important to get this resolved ASAP.

## Skagit County Noxious Weed Control Board

### Coordinators report

July 16, 2020

#### General

- **Conex Box Storage**

Installed a fan system into the Conex box.

- **CWMA Responsibility**

We have received responses and have a working draft of the MOU put together from all of our partners and will be moving forward with the agreement and get signatures from the different agencies. We have a more complete CWMA agreement now after DNR reviewed and updated the MOU. We are going to send this to our partners soon. This is a non-binding MOU that just signifies our commitment to work together to eradicate knotweed in Skagit County.

- **Hiring**

We were able to hire Monica Vickers, Joshua Phillips and Karin Porrini as our seasonal Noxious weed Aids. Monica is currently getting her bachelors in environmental economics. Karin Porrini is a past graduate of the BASEC program from Skagit Valley College and Joshua is new to the environmental field. We are glad to have them apart of the crew. Monica, Josh, and Karin all went to get their pesticide licenses and passed.

- **COVID-19 work plan.**

Not much has changed from our previous work plan but there is a general lack in cooperative efforts due to this. Also we have noticed a lot more landowners are meeting us on site as well as seeing us in the field and it has increased our overall public interaction and visibility. This may be due to more people staying at home. We continue to wear masks in the field when closer than 6 ft. We are also trying to clean our shared equipment more often and to try and plan around having to use them.

- **Spray Applications**

Overall we have 51 application records between Christie and I. We have been able to do more treatments with Christie being around early in the season and we put a lot of effort on Poison Hemlock. Unfortunately we haven't been able to address Thistle spp. but I plan on doing more surveys and notifications next week. Overall I sent 8 letters to landowners with poison hemlock infestations and all of them were responsive and either mowed or sprayed the plants in question.

- **Bio Control**

We did receive Scotch broom bio control and released them in Marble Mount near an area of Seattle City Light property and some private property where we have been getting complaints. We are still awaiting purple loosestrife insects but it seems that we may not be able to get those insects this year due to a lack of collection staff.

### **Cooperative Efforts**

- **Talking fields area with WDFW and WSDA**

We are planning on working with WDFW on July 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> if weather and equipment allows.

- **Ika and Craft island surveys**

We are scheduled to have WSDA assist us on July 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> for Craft and Ika boat surveys for Spartina. Depending on access we may also do the Swinomish Channel and the Spit Islands if time allows.

- **Skagit river site Mixmasters Sand Bar.**

Andy Wargo and Aida Miller assisted us at our Skagit river site. To go and Spray Knotweed and to EZ-Ject lance English ivy, Old Man's Beard and Scotch broom. We had various transportation and access issues and therefore we spent some time clearing the trail that access the area. Also we had to cut some locks on a gate to attach a county lock to avoid the mile hike in and out of the site. We saw great control from last year's treatment and now need to extend further into the property. We are planning on returning to the site later this season.



- **Padilla Bay Dike with Skagit County Parks, and Dike District 12**



For the last 3 years we have been working with Skagit County Parks and Dike District 12 to try and eradicate the poison hemlock from the dike. This year our treatment did not work very well so we spent two rainy days pulling and bagging the plant material to try and get a handle on the population. Dike District 12 was able to transport the material to the transfer station and purchased the chemical for us to treat and Parks has been helping with mowing and maintaining the area. We hope to possibly do one more years' worth of treatment to knock back the seed set.



- **Garlic Mustard on South Skagit Highway**

Christie and I have been treating garlic mustard on private and state lands in the concrete area to try and get a handle on the infestation that is growing near the Dalles bridge. All of the property owners have been receptive and proactive towards its eradication. I finally got in touch with the property owner for the largest infestation and will explore grant options to help cover the treatment costs. The landowner/manager is from California and is not up here often and it makes it hard to get a crew out to do the work. Now that we have a treatment agreement we will work on the site early next spring and see what progress we can make. This infestation is spreading and we are seeing it pop up in elk and wildlife trails. The assumption being that the elk are transporting the garlic mustard. There is a lot of elk sign in the areas of infestation.



### Education and outreach

- **Cape Horn Community**

I have met with multiple landowners and they have expressed a desire to get rid of their knotweed on their community, since this property is a couple miles downstream of our current work I am unable to commit to the new area. Once our CWMA reaches concrete then I can propose using WSDA funds for the work needed on Cape Horn rd.

- **Landowner letters interactions**

This year with Christies help we were able to send out letters to all the property owners of our tidelands regarding Spartina and the landowners on the Samish river and Grandy Creek to update more landowner agreements. Overall I have gotten 44 new treatment agreements from our mass mailings and had a lot of phone calls and discussions with other landowners that did not wish to have this work done. We gained permissions from multiple landowners that we were unable to in the past which connects a lot of our treatments sites. From our Spartina letters we have gotten 10 different landowners contact information updated.
