Small group policy discussion

- Members divided into four groups and addressed the following questions
 - O How do we define policy?
 - o Knowing our priority areas and the work of the last five years, what would our policy platform include?
 - o Knowing our platform better: what more do we need to know? What key questions need to be answered? What are the next steps?
- The following are summary remarks from the small group discussion.

- We should focus on our 3 priorities (opioids, housing, MCH)
 - Get a better idea of our progress to date and what might be missing in relation to policy
 - Decided if we are ready to go forward? Or dive deeper?
- o Conduct an Environmental Scan of our County partners, look for alignment
 - What are others counties and organizations doing?
- Our policy should be a CALL TO ACTION
- Our policy should promote EQUITY and equitable outcomes
- Policy as a response to a need
 - Want to be simple, broad
 - Always answer the WHY?
- Policy could focus on education, communication and positive messaging
- Should we have a policy committee?
 - Support alignment between local and state policy
 - Where are we collectively comfortable taking risks?
- Think of policy as a strategy and do the groundwork
- Policy perspective in business?
 - "Health in all policies"
- What is next?
 - Need to know if three priorities are successful and we can move on or do we need to continue to invest?
 - We need a policy framework to analyze
 - O What are our metrics?
 - o How do we develop a policy agenda with BOH?
