


#### **Bullying**

Youth who say they were bullied in the past month. Bullying is defined as when another student/ students say or do nasty or unpleasant things, or when a student is teased repeatedly in a way he or she doesn't like. It is NOT bullying when two students of about the same strength argue or fight.

#### **Dating Violence**

Youth who say they dated someone in past year who ever limited activities, threatened, or made them feel unsafe in any way.



Campylobacter Sources include raw poultry, raw milk and contamination from these raw items to other foods that are not cooked (e.g. salad ingredients). Nationwide, approximately 16% of cases are hospitalized. Ageadjusted rates per 100,000 are shown.



#### Salmonella

Pervasive in the environment. Infections can result from contaminated food, often poultry or raw eggs, or handling reptiles and other animals. Children under 5 are most vulnerable. About 29% of diagnosed cases are hospitalized. Ageadjusted rates per 100,000 are shown.

#### E. Coli


Common sources include most animal foods, including raw meats, raw milk, anything potentially contaminated with fecal material. Recently there has been an increase in outbreaks associated with E.coli contaminated produce.

 There were 10 cases in Skagit County in 2013.

#### Vibrio

Common in our area and most frequently associated with raw or undercooked shellfish – primarily oysters. Foods contaminated with shellfish juices can result in infection. While total number of cases is small, 19% are hospitalized.

 There were 4 cases of non-cholera Vibriosis in Skagit County in 2014.


























# Percent of pregnant women receiving prenatal care in first trimester, 1990-2014




#### Definition:

This indicates comprehensive medical care during pregnancy, labor and delivery, and postpartum. Services include screening for medical and other conditions known to increase the risk of poor outcomes and treatment for those conditions.


Chlamydia is the most commonly reported sexually transmitted infection in WA and the US. Chlamydia disease cases reported to the Department of Health are shown as the annual rate per 100,000 population of females ages 15-24.







# **Definitions:**

# **Fruit Consumption**


100% fruit juice, fresh, frozen or canned fruit

# **Vegetable Consumption**

Beans, dark green vegetables or greens, orange-colored vegetables, and other vegetables.

Recommendations for daily consumption are based on age and gender and activity level (universal "five a day" recommendations are no longer used).

# Definition: Youth fruit and vegetable consumption


Calculated based on asking youth how many times in the past week they:

- Drank 100% fruit juice such as orange juice, apple juice or grape juice
- Ate fruit
- Ate green salad?
- Ate potatoes? (not including fries or potato chips)
- Ate carrots?
- Ate other vegetables?

The Centers for Disease Control recommends at least 5 servings per day.






# Physically Active Youth









# Ever considered suicide, 6th grade students, 2002-2014







# **Poverty**



# Children in Poverty


Children living in households that fall below the federal poverty level.






