**Skagit Change Maker Award** - Inspired by the life of Terry Belcoe, the Skagit Change Maker award honors an individual who is action-oriented, boundary-crossing and solution-focused in their commitment to community improvement. They go above and beyond their profession or work, mentor current and future community leaders, inspire others to action, and put service above self. As a lifetime achievement award, it recognizes someone with 20 or more years of service to their community.
