The group unanimously approved the previous meeting minutes

Also, Stacy Phelps is no longer with the Upper Skagit Indian Tribe. David will reach out to Marilyn Scott to determine a replacement for her tribal representation

• Review of Steering Composition

Carol has reached out to Mary McGoffin to be a part of the Steering committee. Suggestions

- Reach out to Skagit Regional Health (Connie Davis) to determine the availability of attending Steering. If unavailable, replacing with a clinical health representative from the Membership

Carol agreed to follow up with Mary McGoffin to communicate the level of commitment and determine interest in joining the Steering Committee. Dependent on the response from Skagit Regional Health, the group agreed to reach out to Chris Johnston next. David and Kristen will also see whether SeaMar might be available.

- Approach each with a tailored presentation to the county, include accolades for parallel work in their jurisdiction or collaborations
- o Make objectives, intentions and asks clear
- Add Kiwanis, Chambers and Rotary meetings as channels to communicate and educate the community and jurisdictions
- Create a promo video for the PHT History to use on Skagit 21 and for the beginning of the presentations, including testimonials on how these health issues have impacted them
- Include an op-ed for the Skagit Valley Herald on Housing-suggested Phil Brockman, Mary Ellen Lykins, and Ken Lawson to collectively write on Health in relation to Housing for children and youth

The group agreed to proceed with presentations when feasible, beginning with housing, which will include a short history of the PHT, housing and how it relates to health, and how it relates to the cities. Bill agreed to work on a Housing presentation for the first presentation, and suggested including some PHT members to be involved. Kristen will begin scheduling throughout the community and compiling a panel for involvement. Kristen and David will reach out to the Skagit Valley Herald and then to Phil, Mary Ellen and Ken to request involvement with Herald op-ed.
