# **JAIL HOUSING SUMMARY**

# **Utilization of Jail Beds Outside Skagit County**

## **Example Costs (present day):**

## **Snohomish County Jail**

Daily rate \$65.00 plus transport costs (transport averages \$100 per month per inmate) Annual cost: daily rate: \$23,725.00 plus 12 months of transport: 1,200.00 Total Annual cost per inmate: \$24,925.00.per year

#### Yakima County Jail

Daily rate \$57.00 (includes up to 3 transports per week)
Total Annual cost for per inmate: \$20,805.00 per year

# Estimates of Inmate Shipping Costs into the future 1:

(Projected population from Voorhis (revised 9/14/12): Using 1988 – 2003 Reduced Incarceration rates)

2015 - Projected 240 ADP - (170 existing beds) = 70 shipped inmates = \$1.4 M to \$1.7M per year

2020 - Projected 275 ADP - (170 existing beds) = 105 shipped inmates = \$2.2 M to \$2.6M per year

2030 - Projected 361 ADP - (170 existing beds) = 191 shipped inmates = \$3.9 M to \$4.8 M per year

2040 - Projected 462 ADP - (170 existing beds) = 292 shipped inmates = \$6.0 M to \$7.3 M per year

#### Factors Limiting the Number of Skagit County Inmates Available For Outside Housing:

It is oftentimes difficult to house Skagit County inmates at other facilities. This may make it impossible to house the projected overcrowding at another facility due to the following reasons:

- 1) Inmates with frequent court appearances require frequent transportation. Approximately 60% of the current jail population are pre-sentence with frequent court appearances.
- 2) Some inmates are needed for trustee work
- 3) Some inmates are not eligible for outside housing.
- 3) There is a lack of holding space in current facility for those inmates transported back.
