Item C-3: Binding Site Plan Revisions

 The Planning Commission recommends to the Board of County Commissioners to approve County Staff's proposed amendments to Skagit County Code 14.18.500(2)(c) to remove the requirement for a Binding Site Plan to be completed for commercial or industrial development that involves two or more leases.

- a. The amendment is supported by Goal 11B-6 of the Economic Development Chapter of the Comprehensive Plan.
 b. The amendment is consistent with Washington RCW 58.17.035 which authorizes the County to provide a Binding Site Plan review process.
 - c. The amendment is consistent with the Skagit County Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) which identifies the need for "... land available for sale-lease and ready-to-occupy buildings available to smaller tenants.
 - d. The amendment provides the opportunity for small and emerging business to be able to lease commercial and industrial space without the need to process a land division which promotes economic development and has been found to be consistent with Goal 5 and Policy 5.15 of the Countywide Planning Policies.

The Planning Commission finds that the cost difference is negligible between an

Administrative Special Use and a Hearings Examiner Special Use.

Item PL18-0404: Modify Mineral Resource Overlay (MRO)

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- 1. The Planning Commission recommends to the Board of County Commissioners to approve the petitioner's request to remove a Mineral Resource Overlay, adjacent Mangat Estates, located north of Highway 20 and East of Highway 9.
 - a. The amendment is consistent with Policies 4D-1.1, 4D-1.2, and 4D-1.3 of Goal 4D-1 of the Comprehensive Plan.
 - b. New geological data submitted by the petitioner entitled *Mineral Resources Overlay Assessment: Skagit County Parcel 127899* finds that there is no longer the potential for mineral resources of regional or long-term significance on the site
 - c. The Mineral Resource Overlay (MRO) limits the residential density of the underlying zone and properties within ¼ mile of the MRO in order to protect regional and long-term significant aggregate resources. Site investigations determined there are no resources within the MRO that warrant protection.
 - d. The removal of the MRO will not change the underlying zoning designation or create an isolated land use designation (spot zone).

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e. The County mailed notices to the property owners and property owners of the affected properties of the lands subject to the proposed Mineral Resource Overlay removal.

Recommendation, Findings of Fact and Reasons for Action, February 25, 2020

Item P-1: Modify SCC 14.24.380: Rainwater Catchment

- Planning Commission recommends the Board of County Commissioners direct the Planning Department to remove barriers to rainwater catchment where appropriate in the code on Guemes Island; and to direct them to create an engineered template which may be used to permit a rainwater catchment system in-lieu of an independently designed system.
 - The amendment does not propose to alter the comprehensive plan and has been found by staff to be consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.
 - b. The Planning Commission finds there is a serious seawater intrusion problem on Guemes Island and believes that reducing barriers to development of rainwater catchment systems is important.
 - c. The technology exists to ensure these rainwater catchment systems are a safe option for providing potable water.
 - d. The Planning Commission finds that rainwater catchment is a <u>safe and [ML]</u> viable potable water source that is used around the world.
 - e. There are other areas within Skagit County that could benefit from rainwater catchment as a source of potable water.
 - f. There was a large amount of verbal and written support for the proposed petition from the public, and [ML] no opposition, from the public to the proposed petition. [ML]

Item P-2: Modify SCC 14.24: Guemes Island Wells

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- 1. The Planning recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners that docket item P-2, to modify well drilling approval for new wells on Guemes Island be denied.
 - a. The Planning Commission finds there is a serious seawater intrusion problem on Guemes Island. [ML]
 - b. The Planning Commission realizes that multiple wells on Guemes Island have failed due to seawater intrusion. [ML]
 - c. The Planning Commission realizes that the single source aquifer itself may be vulnerable to failure because of seawater intrusion. [ML]
 - d. The Planning Commission received a large volume of public testimony, written and verbal, unanimously in favor of the proposal. [ML]
 - a.e. The Planning Commission has been advised that Skagit County only has jurisdiction to review the location of proposed wells prior to drilling when in concert with a development application.
 - f. The Planning Commission is not willing to advise any changes to the current regulations due to legal advice from the Skagit Prosecuting Attorney's office. [ML]
 - b. The Planning Commission is following the legal advice provided by the Skagit Prosecuting Attorney's office. [ML]
 - e.g. Staff intends to DRAFT an Administrative Official Interpretation that states that wells are not required to be drilled or determined not to be feasible prior to permitting a rainwater catchment system.

Item P-4: Great Blue Herons

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1. The Planning Commission recommends to the Board of County Commissioners to deny the request.

- a. The Planning Commission <u>agrees with the consensus of public opinion [ML] finds</u> that the Great Blue Heron population within Skagit County is of great importance.
- b. The Planning Commission received a large amount of written and verbal public testimony unanimously in favor of this proposal but for one letter from the Forest Advisory Board asking for more study of this issue prior to making a decision. [ML]
- This proposal received a large amount of public attention during the public comment period, including a front page article in the weekly paper. [ML]
- d. No individuals or businesses within the affected area of the proposal spoke or wrote in opposition to this proposal. [ML]
- e. This proposal fulfills the Comprehensive Plan Goals 5A-1 and 5A-5. [ML]
- f. This proposal fulfills the Skagit County Planning Policies 10.1 and 10.6. [ML]
- g. The Planning Commission finds this proposal in opposition to Skagit County Planning Policy 6.2. [ML]
- b.h. The Planning Commission finds the overall population of the Great Blue Heron is not in decline.
- e.i. Bald Eagles may be the primary reason for nesting site abandonment.
- d.j. The Planning Commission finds that there is no known reason as to why the rookery at Samish Island was abandoned.

Commented [PG4]: Commissioner Lundsten (ML): I do not think the list of twenty-one findings defines how we handled this proposal. The PC's problem with the proposal was the perceived

The PC's problem with the proposal was the perceived infringement on the rights of property owners in the affected area. A majority of members of the PC did not think that property owners should have to follow noise level restrictions during certain parts of the year on activities within the County's control for the sake of one species of bird. Clearly the single, core issue, it was not mentioned in the list of twenty-one.
