DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)
FOR A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A SALMON HERITAGE PROGRAM IN
SKAGIT COUNTY IN RESPONSE TO A WESTERN WASHINGTON GROWTH
MANAGEMENT HEARINGS BOARD'S ORDER IN CASE NO. 02-2-0012C

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL: A non-project legislative action to establish a Salmon Heritage Program (SHP) consistent with the Skagit County's Critical Areas Ordinance (Skagit County Code Chapter 14.24). The SHP will acquire riparian habitat conservation easements (buffers) in rural areas in Skagit County. The SHP targets salmon habitat. The goal of the SHP is to acquire at least eighty percent (80%) of the available riparian habitat that will in turn be protected and/or restored to fully functioning status.

LOCATION OF PROPOSAL: Lands within unincorporated areas of Skagit County, WA that are zoned Agriculture-NRL and Rural Resource - NRL.

PROPONENT/LEAD AGENCY: Skagit County Planning & Development Services.

FINDINGS: The lead agency for this proposal has determined that it does not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c). The decision was made after review of a completed environmental checklist and other information on file with the lead agency. This information is available to the public on request. This DNS is issued under WAC 197-11-340 (2). The lead agency will not take final action on this proposal for 60 days from the date of public notice below.

A Public Hearing Notice for the proposal was published on March 22, 2007 in the Skagit Valley Herald. On March 22, 2007 the proposal documents will be available on the Skagit County website (www.skagitcounty.net).

COMMENT PERIOD: The comment period on this DNS is from March 23, 2007 to April 9, 2007. Written correspondence, including facsimile transmittal may be submitted to: Skagit County Planning and Development Services, c/o Tom Karsh, 1800 Continental Place, Mount Vernon, Washington, 98273 or by FAX (360) 336-9416. Written comments (faxed, mailed, or delivered) will be accepted. Comments on the proposal must be submitted on 8 ½" x 11" paper. Maps must be in black and white and also reduced to 8 ½" x 11" size for reproduction purposes. Submittals not meeting these requirements will, unfortunately, not be considered. Comments must be received at the Planning and Development Services Department by 4:30 p.m. Monday April 9, 2007. E-mails will not be accepted.
