SKAGIT COUNTY DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS) AMENDING SKAGIT COUNTY CODE TO CREATE A SALMON HERITAGE PROGRAM AND IN RESPONSE TO WESTERN WASHINGTON GROWTH MANAGEMENT HEARINGS BOARD'S ORDER IN CASE NO. 02-2-0012C

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL: A non-project legislative action to consider amendments to Skagit County Code Title 14 (Unified Development Code) including Chapter 14.24 Critical Areas Ordinance and Chapter 14.44 Enforcement to better protect salmon habitat and ongoing agriculture. The Code amendments reflect the changes necessary to implement a proposed Salmon Heritage Program (SHP) which will protect riparian habitat with a program to acquire riparian conservation easements (buffers). The SHP will be established by resolution, a separate non-legislative action that will have its own SEPA determination). The amendments reflect that with a buffer acquisition program there is no need to continue monitoring fish habitat trends or to determine whether a particular activity is causing harm or degradation. Chapter 14.44 is being amended to enhance compliance monitoring and enforcement for the critical areas ordinance regulations including the SHP.

LOCATION OF PROPOSAL: Lands with ongoing agriculture within unincorporated areas of Skagit County, WA that are zoned Agriculture-NRL and Rural Resource - NRL.

PROPONENT/LEAD AGENCY: Skagit County Planning & Development Services.

FINDINGS: The lead agency for this proposal has determined that it does not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c). The decision was made after review of a completed environmental checklist and other information on file with the lead agency. This information is available to the public on request. This DNS is issued under WAC 197-11-340 (2). The lead agency will not take final action on this proposal for 60 days from the date of public notice below.

A Public Hearing Notice for the proposal was published on March 22, 2007 in the Skagit Valley Herald. On March 22, 2007 the proposal documents will be available on the Skagit County website (www.skagitcounty.net).
