PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Notice is hereby given that on October 5, 2017, Skagit County Planning and Development Services approved the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) checklist review submitted in association with Special Use Permit application #PL17-0155. The special use permit application proposes the replacement of an existing 71 foot tall monopole with a new 100 foot tall monopole. The monopole is located at an existing Wireless Communication Facility within a Puget Sound Energy (PSE) substation at the intersection of Summit Park Road and Thompson Road. The replacement will include the new monopole, six (6) panel antennas, one (1) six foot tall omni antenna for PSE communications, equipment cabinets and 20KW back up diesel generator. All components of the facility will be contained within a 30'x 30' leased area; additional space within the leased area and on the monopole is reserved for future wireless carriers (co-location). The applicants indicate that ground disturbance (fill & grade) work associated with this project will be limited to what is required to install a new foundation for monopole, equipment slab, power/fiber lines and fence posts.
