PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Notice is hereby given that on August 5, 2019, Skagit County Planning and Development Services approved the independent State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) checklist review (#PL19-0360) for the Colony Mountain Drive Culvert Replacement Project. The project proposal includes the removal of two existing culverts (a failed 2 foot metal culvert and a 3 foot cpp culvert) and the installation of a new 10 foot wide, 78 lineal foot, metal corrugated culvert to allow for fish passage and storm event stream flows in Harrison Creek under Colony Mountain Drive. The project includes the removal of approximately 1,200 cubic yards of material from the roadway prism for the replacement of the culvert. The proposed project is located within the Rural Reserve (RRv) zoning/comprehensive plan designated area as indicated in the Skagit County Comprehensive Plan and associated maps adopted July 5, 2016 and as thereafter amended.

PROJECT LOCATION: The project is located adjacent to 4168 Colony Mountain Drive where Harrison Creek crosses under Colony Mountain Drive, Bow, within a portion of Section 26, Township 36N, Range 3E W.M., situated within Skagit County, Washington.

LEAD AGENCY: Skagit County Planning and Development Services.

The lead agency for this proposal has determined that it does not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030 (2)(C). This decision was made after review of a completed environmental checklist, critical areas checklist, and other information on file with the lead agency. This information is available to the public on request.

The Lead Agency previously issued a comment period for this proposal under the Optional DNS process outlined under WAC 197-11-355.

You may appeal this threshold determination by addressing those criteria as set forth in Skagit County Code 14.06 and 16.12 and then by filing such with the Skagit County Planning and Development Services for service to the SEPA responsible official within fourteen (14) calendar days after the publication date of this threshold determination.
