For Northwest Straits Foundation Similk Bay shoreline armor removal and nearshore restoration

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Proposed nearshore restoration proposal on two residential properties and across an existing County right of way/access accomplished through the removal of approximately 95 linear feet of concrete bulkhead, removal of approximately 95 linear feet (25 cubic yards) of rock revetment and removal of approximately 5 cubic yards of debris (angular rocks/concrete) from the existing access area. Suitable materials will be reused to fill voids from bulkhead removal using on-site material, regrading of native soils and the import of beach nourishment material. Nearshore and upland disturbed areas will be replanted with native vegetation upon completion of the project.

PROPONENT: Northwest Straits Foundation

PROJECT LOCATION: The project is located at 14403 Jura Lane and 14387 Jura Drive, within Northeast ¼ of Section 17, Township 34 North, Range 2 East, W.M., Skagit County, Washington. P73628 and P73626.

LEAD AGENCY: Skagit County Planning and Development Services
