



Skagit Alternatives Futures

- is a long-term,
- watershed-wide
- visioning, modeling, and planning process that seeks to maintain:
- the health of the Skagit ecosystem,
- its natural resource industries,
- and its communities and economy
- in the face of population growth, climate change, and other large-scale changes.

What are some of the challenges looking out 50 years?

- One of the fastest growing counties in Washington
- Population expected to nearly double in 50 years
- Local governments face challenges providing services (regional jails, schools, health care facilities, roads, etc.)
- New residents, builders, farmers, foresters, conservationists and others compete for same land
- One quarter of population lives in floodplain and could face serious damage in a major flood
- Flood risk likely to increase due to climate change





The preferred future will draw on elements of the four alternatives to maintain:

- Commercially viable and sustainable agricultural and forest products industries
- An ecosystem that supports healthy and resilient communities of people and native species
- Highly livable, economically viable urban and rural communities
- A strong and resilient economy

Expected Outcomes

- Develop a 50-year vision for conservation and development in the Skagit
- Identify strategies to implement the vision including recommendations for:
 - County, city and tribal comprehensive plans and development regulations
 - State land management agencies
 - Conservation groups, natural resource industries, and businesses
