Approval of Minutes (4/12/2022)

Chair Raschko introduced the meeting minutes from the last meeting (4/12/2022) for approval. A motion to approve the April 12^{th} meeting minutes was initiated by Commissioner Rose and was seconded by Commissioner Candler. There was no discussion and the minutes were approved unanimously.

Work Session: Stormwater Code Update

Peter Gill, Long Range Planning Manager, provided an overview of the meeting materials and how to review site plan sketches. Mr. Gill also went over the timeline for the project and highlighted the public meetings on April 28th and April 29th for the public to hear from staff on the update.

Andy Wargo, Stormwater Technician, used site plan examples to discuss how the stormwater requirements will change within the NPDES permit area and a non-NPDES permit area site.

Director's Update

Director Hal Hart updated the Planning Commission on growth. Seattle has the third highest amount of cranes in North America. Housing projects are dominating the use, followed by infrastructure. Growth is continuing to move north as smaller jurisdictions such as Everett, Marysville, and Stanwood are seeing significant residential expansion. Locally, Burlington is leading growth in the County. Director Hart then discussed the legislative work that is happening after the state session concluded to implement new programs and regulations.

Peter Gill then updated the Planning Commission on the adoption of the 2021 Docket and the dates of the public workshops on Stormwater amendments.
