- Bicycle free with passenger convenience pass.
- Needs-based passes must be purchased in person at 1800 Continental Place during normal business hours ahead of sailing. Eligibility: Guemes Island residents who qualify for and are actively enrolled in the County's Senior Citizens & Disable Persons Exemption program, as administered by the Skagit County Assessor's Office, per RCW 84.36.381, providing certain property tax exemptions for qualifying persons.



TICKET SALES

Riders should purchase tickets online at skagitcounty.net/ferry or on our mobile app to save time at the terminal. In person ticket sales are available at the ferry terminal at 500 I Avenue, Anacortes. You will receive a QR code that will be scanned prior to boarding.

Only credit/debit is accepted at the ferry terminal. Cash payments can be made at 1800 Continental Place, Mount Vernon, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Ticket sales are nonrefundable. No exceptions.

Ticket sales and validation will cease 2 minutes before boarding.

- Extra run occasionally offered immediately following 11:15 a.m. sailing, if available, as determined by the Ferry Division Manager or designee. Advanced reservations required, service not guaranteed. For advanced reservations, call ferry terminal office (360) 416-1466 or email ferrycomments@co.skagit.wa.us.
- Rate covers one trip to Guemes Island & one return trip to Anacortes. HAZMAT fare may be split by multiple companies onboard and applies regardless of how many trucks travel.
- After-hours ferry services limited to 3-hour maximum and dependent on availability of vessel and crew. Service is not guaranteed. Advance reservations are recommended.
- Emergency services dispatched by 911, Sheriff, Fire, or Utilities outside of the published schedule, subject to availability.

HOLIDAY SAILING SCHEDULE - Ferry will run on a **SATURDAY NONPEAK** schedule ending at 10:00 p.m. when New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, or Christmas fall on a Sunday through Thursday.

BOARDING AND SAFETY POLICIES

Your safety is our highest priority, and we request you follow all crewmember instructions. All vehicles and walk-on passengers should remain in designated waiting areas until directed by crew.

Boarding is first come, first served. Reservations are not accepted.

Staff will stop scanning tickets two minutes prior to boarding. Late arrivals will not be accommodated.

Please park bicycles and motorcycles where directed by the crew. Motorcyclists must remain with their bike at all times. Please be prepared to keep your bike stable during the crossing and in changing conditions. Bicycles and motorcycles ride at their own risk.

It is illegal to drive onto the ferry while talking on a cell phone.

It is illegal to drive on to the ferry with children on the driver's lap. Even a slight misjudgment could result in damage or injury.

When driving on the ferry, shut off all vehicle lights. Vehicle lights make the loading process difficult for the crew.

Shut off your engine and set your emergency brake. At no time shall engines be left running during the crossing.

Keep your car doors closed until the vessel is loaded. Opening doors in a lane being loaded can result in delays, damage, or injury.

Do not walk between cars, especially during loading, unloading, and landings. A hard landing could result in the movement of cars, thus threatening possible injury for people who may be in between vehicles.

Keep animals on leashes at all times.

Open containers of alcohol are prohibited per WA state law. Skagit County reserves the right to refuse passage to anyone who is obviously intoxicated or impaired.

Up to two, 6-gallon portable gasoline containers are allowed only in the open bed of a truck or on open trailers, provided they are in good condition, declared to the crew, and capped and stowed properly.
