Guemes Island Ferry Drydock Update

Here is an update on the work completed and still to be finished:

The drydock work is continuing at Nichol's Brothers Boat Builders (NBBB). Skagit County's Ferry Division is working with the United States Coast Guard (USCG) on obtaining the vessel's drydock credit for the Certificate of Inspection, which has not yet been completed. County Commissioners Ron Wesen and Peter Browning were able to take separate tours of the shipyard on Thursday, April 24, to hear updates on the work and see the vessel in person.

- New engine foundations and enclosures have been fabricated, and installation is ongoing. These are critical components, requiring meticulous attention to ensure the quality and safety standards are met.
- Brand new engines and drivelines, rebuilt reduction gears, outdrives, and an auxiliary generator still need to be reinstalled onboard.

The ongoing work on the engine foundations and enclosures is continuing to delay the return of the ferry to service. At this time, we are at least a week and a half delayed beyond the original return date of April 30th. We will not be able to provide a firm return date until the work is completed at Nichol's Brothers. Once the work in the drydock is complete, and before the vessel can depart from the contractor's facility, several days of testing and trials will be required. Once the ferry arrives back in Anacortes, the vessel will be out of service for an additional 2-3 days to complete a USCG-required incline test for a new stability letter. Only after issuance of the new stability letter can the vessel re-enter regular service.
