**Introduction** Skagit County VSP work group members are responsible for providing

input and making decisions to achieve the goals and benchmarks of the VSP Work Plan. VSP work group members serve without compensation

in 3-year terms as appointed by Skagit County Commissioners.

## **Essential Duties & Responsibilities**

- 1. Attend 6-8 VSP meetings a year, in person preferred.
- 2. Oversee and assist Coordinator with VSP implementation to ensure the Work Plan goals and benchmarks are met.
- 3. Provide education about voluntary stewardship, critical areas, and the program.
- 4. Foster and build partnerships in the Skagit community.
- 5. Approve biennium implementation budget.
- 6. Approve Work Group policies and Technical Provider projects.
- 7. Every 2 years, help the Coordinator submit programmatic report.
- 8. Every 5 years, help the Coordinator review, edit, and submit a programmatic progress report.
- 9. Adaptively manage goals and benchmarks.

## Preferred Knowledge & Skills

- 1. Have an interest in preserving critical areas and agriculture through voluntary actions and best management practices
- 2. Be familiar with background and functions of VSP work
- 3. Have experience or expertise in watershed systems or watershed management
- 4. Ability to be open-minded, think creatively, and bring a broad-based perspective
