FLOOD WILL NOT HURT GRAIN FIELDS

Very little damage has been done by the flood to the berry and grain fields, says County Horticulturist E. D. Hunter. In fact, Mr. Hunter states, the silt deposits was beneficial. Only where there was a strong current or where the water stands for a week or longer, will there be a possibility of loss. No pastures will be impaired. Mr. Hunter has also been asked about stored potatoes which were wet and says that where water did not remain upon the potatoes for too long a period and where they were dried out as soon as possible they will not be affected.
