ENGINEER IS HIRED FOR RIVER SURVEY

The county commissioners this week employed Mr. Stewart, a government engineer, to make a survey of the Skagit river. Mr. Stewart's salary is \$250 a month, which will be paid out of the money to be raised by the 1 mill levy for river improvement.

The new engineer is from the government office in Seattle, and is working under government orders. His work here will be under the supervision of the county engineer's office. He is already at work testing the river and tributary streams for their flow and volume of water carried, and other data needed to determine flood remedies.
