

Update 1 – February 22, 2024

6.2.11 Is there a requirement missing in this space, or is it supposed to be blank?

A: There is no requirement in 6.2.11, this is a typographic error.

Requirement 6.3.1 states the estimated number of users will be “forty (20)”, what is the correct number of estimated users of the system.

A: The estimated number of users of the system is 20.

How many data entry users you expect vs how many read only users?

A: 20 users with both read and write capability.

You mention you’ve been using the Probatum system for a couple of decades. For your data conversion, what is your expectation for converted data?

A: We have a three year retention rule for cases. So the date of last data entry would start the 3 year rule. Once passed that 3 year mark, we delete the old data. This is our current process.

Are you expecting a complete conversion of all Data, or are you limited to Active Cases?

A: We would need all active cases plus all cases that are less than three years since they were last “touched” for records retention purposes.

What database and version number are you using today (Oracle, MS SQL, etc) .

A: The DB is Postgres (version TBD), but we can, and do, export to SQL Server. Our vendor is working to get us the version number.

What is the size of the database?

A: We have reached out to our vendor to obtain this information.

How many fields of data need to be converted?

A: We have reached out to our vendor to obtain this information.

Do any Documents and images need to be converted?

A: We have PDF, TIF and pictures (not sure of the picture format).

If yes, how many documents and images, and what is the storage size?

A: Documents are stored in AWS S3. We have asked the vendor for current space utilization.
