- 1. The invitation references drawings, but I was unable to locate them, are they available? These are on the bid documents posted online under conference room audio/video drawing.
- 2. The invitation says no substitutes will be accepted. May we submit an alternate bid with slight changes to the product that we believe will make a big difference in longevity and be slightly less expensive overall? Any changes would have to be verified to be able to work with all other components. One changed component cannot result in a new system completely.
- 3. The Invitation lists a podium, but does not specify a model, will this be provided by the owner, or is expected to be on the bid? This would be custom build for the necessary components installed on it.
- 4. The invitation lists 4 mics, but there are 5 mics specified, should it be four or five? Please give detailed pricing and we will reflect that in the total bid as there needs to be more clarification on 4 or 5 but the price should be broken down and we will calculate accordingly.
- 5. The invitation mentions the iPad control "or other devices" We need more clarification on if we would be providing a wireless network specific to this, or if we need to connect the DSP directly to the owner network. There should be a provided wireless option whether they add a network or choose to use public WIFI / Bluetooth to connect should be specified in their proposed bid.

**Q:** Could you please verify the Quantity of AIR-DNA-E-3Y because the Cisco addressed AIR-DNA-E-3Y goes along with CW9163E-B but quantity 65 doesn't make sense, please clarify.

**A:** This bid is associated with a WLC replacement for an existing system. We have existing access points that will not be replaced at this time. We will need licensing for a total of 65 access points.

Q: Is there a block diagram or signal path diagram that illustrates the AV connections?
