#### NOTICE TO ALL

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## **DESCRIPTION OF WORK**

This service consists of the creation of a restoration plan to include initial plan and recommended maintenance and installation of approximately seventeen (17) acres of native riparian plant species near Mount Vernon, WA. All planting shall be completed by Monday, March 31, 2025. All work shall be completed by Friday, May 30, 2025.



The venue of all causes of action arising from the advertisement, award, execution, and performance of the contract shall be in the Superior Court of the Contracting Agency where the Contracting Agency's headquarters are located.

The following provisions are made a part of this contract and supersede any conflicting provisions of the Washington State Department of Transportation 2024 Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge and Municipal Construction (Standard Specifications) and the foregoing Amendments to the Standard Specifications.

#### CONTRACT TIME REQUIREMENTS:

Planting of all species will take place <u>BY Monday, March 31, 2025.</u> All work shall be completed by Friday, May 30, 2025.

The duration of the contract shall be for one (1) year from contract execution, with the possibility of a one-year extension by mutual agreement between the Contractor and Skagit County Public Works Department personnel.

**NON-MANDATORY PRE-BIDDING MEETING**: An optional, non-mandatory pre-bid meeting will be held **Monsday, September 9, 2024 at 1:00 p.m.** at the project site. Access is off Highway 9 via the construction entrance immediately south of 13987 State Route 9, Mount Vernon, WA 98273 (Figure 1).

**NOTICE TO PROCEED:** Contractor shall not commence work until notice to proceed has been given by Skagit County; this occurs after the Contract has been executed by Skagit County Board of Commissioners.

**QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:** All technical questions and requests for interpretation shall be in writing and submitted by email with the subject line reading, "Nookachamps Restoration," no later than **Friday, September 13, 2024 at 5:00 p.m.**, to Emily Derenne, Habitat Restoration Project Manager, <u>emilyjd@co.skagit.wa.us</u>. Questions will not be accepted after this date and time.

**ADDENDA:** If Skagit County issues addenda to this project, Bidders must acknowledge receipt of all addenda on the revised bid proposal. It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure that the Bidder has received all addenda, although Skagit County will make reasonable effort to provide addenda to all plan holders. Addenda will be forwarded to Contractors on the plan holder list via email, and will be posted online at <u>www.skagitcounty.net/rfp.</u> Failure to sign the acknowledgement of addenda on the revised proposal packet may result in rejection of the bid.

All addenda, if needed, will be posted online for this work by 4:00 p.m. on **Tuesday, September 17**, **2024**. All addenda shall become part of the bid package. If further addenda are required to be issued this date, the bid opening may be postponed. Contractors on the plan holder list will be notified of postponement via phone and email. A postponement notice will also be posted online at <u>www.skagitcounty.net/rfp</u>.

**MANDATORY BIDDER RESPONSIBILITY CRITERIA:** Before award, the Bidder must meet the following Bidder responsibility criteria to be considered a responsible Bidder. The Bidder may be required by Skagit County to submit documentation demonstrating compliance with the criteria.

The Bidder must:

- 1. Have a current certificate of registration as a contractor in compliance with Title 18.27 RCW, which must have been in effect at the time of bid submittal;
- 2. Have a current Washington Unified Business Identifier (UBI) number;
- 3. Have Industrial Insurance (workers' compensation) coverage for the Bidder's employees working in Washington, as required in Title 51 RCW;
- 4. Have a Washington Employment Security Department number (ESD), as required in Title 50 RCW, (and, if lowest responsive and responsible Bidder, provide documentation in the form of a letter or statement from ESD within twenty-four (24) hours of submitting bid);
- 5. Have a Washington Department of Revenue state excise tax registration number, as required in Title 82 RCW;
- 6. Not be disqualified from bidding on any public works contract under Title 39.06.010 RCW or Title 39.12.065(3) RCW and;
- 7. Not be excluded or suspended from bidding on any public works contract under federal laws.

**TITLE VI:** Skagit County, in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252,42 U.S.C. 2000d to 2000d-4) and the Regulations, hereby notifies all Bidders that will affirmatively ensure that any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full and fair opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award

**EXAMINATION OF BID AND CONTRACT DOCUMENTS, SITE, AND SITE CONDITIONS**: The Bidder shall carefully examine the Bid Documents as defined in Section 1-01.3 of the 2024 Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge, and Municipal Construction.

Submittal of a bid shall be conclusive evidence that the Bidder has made these examinations and understands all requirements for the performance of the completed Project. The Bidder further warrants, agrees, and acknowledges by submitting a Bid that the Bidder:

- 1. Has taken steps reasonably necessary to ascertain the nature and location of the Work;
- 2. Has investigated and satisfied himself/herself as to the general and local conditions, which can affect the Work or its cost, including but not limited to:
  - a. Conditions bearing upon acquisition, transportation, disposal, handling, and storage of materials;
  - b. The availability of labor, materials, water, electric power, and roads;

- c. Uncertainties of weather, river stages, tides, or similar physical conditions at the site;
- d. The conformation and condition of the ground;
- e. The character of equipment and facilities needed preliminary to and during Work performance; and
- f. The site biological hazards and associated physical hazards.
- 3. Has satisfied himself/herself as to the character, quality, and quantity of surface and subsurface materials or obstacles to be encountered insofar as this information is reasonably ascertainable from an inspection of the Work site (including material sites) as well as from the Bid Documents and other information made a part of this Contract; and
- 4. Has satisfied himself/herself as to the adequacy of time allowed for the completion of the physical Work on the Contract.

Any failure of the Bidder to take the actions described and acknowledged in this clause shall not relieve the Bidder from responsibility for estimating properly the difficulty and cost of successfully performing the Work, or from proceeding to successfully perform the Work without additional expense to the Contracting Agency.

The Bidder agrees that the Contracting Agency shall not be liable to it on any claim for additional payment or additional time or any claim whatsoever if the claim directly or indirectly results from the Bidder's failure to investigate and familiarize himself/herself sufficiently with the conditions under which the Contract is to be performed.

The Bidder shall be familiar and comply with all Federal, State, tribal, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations which might affect those engaged in the Work. The Contracting Agency will not consider any plea of misunderstanding or ignorance of such requirements.

**BID PRICE:** The Bidder shall submit the completed Bid Proposal as part of the bid. Bid prices shall reflect what the Bidder anticipates the cost of completing the Work to be, including furnishing all material, labor, equipment, and Subcontractors, and other facilities and all management, superintendent's labor and service as outlined in the Provisions, except as may be provided otherwise in the Contract documents. Except as the Contract may provide, the Bidder shall receive no payment for any costs that exceed those in the bid prices. In the event of a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price, the unit price will govern and Skagit County will correct total price accordingly.

The Contractor shall bear all cost for such insurance as provided in Section 1-07.10. No Claim shall be allowed because of any ambiguity in the Contract if:

- 1. The Bidder discovers an ambiguity but fails to notify the Contracting Agency, or
- 2. The Bidder failed to discover a patent ambiguity that would be discovered by a reasonably prudent contractor in preparing its Bid.

Any prospective Bidder desiring an explanation or interpretation of the Bid Documents, shall request the explanation or interpretation in writing by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, September 13, 2024 to allow a written reply to reach all prospective Bidders before the submission of their Bids. Oral explanations, interpretations, or instructions given by anyone before the Award of a Contract will not be binding on the Contracting Agency.

Any information given a prospective Bidder concerning any of the Bid Documents will be furnished to all prospective Bidders as an Addendum if that information is deemed by the Contracting

Agency to be necessary in submitting Bids or if the Contracting Agency concludes that the lack of the information would be prejudicial to other prospective Bidders.

### **BID PROCEDURES AND CONDITIONS**

**PROPOSAL FORMS:** The Contracting Agency will provide a proposal form for any project on which the Bidder is eligible to bid.

The proposal form will identify the project, list estimated quantities, units of measurement, the items of work, and the materials to be furnished at the unit bid prices. The Bidder shall complete spaces on the proposal form that call for information such as: unit prices; extensions; total bid amount; signatures; date; retail sales taxes; the Bidder's name, address, telephone number, and signature.

**PREPARATION OF PROPOSAL:** The Contracting Agency will accept only those Proposals properly executed on forms it provides.

All prices shall be in legible figures (not words) written in ink or typed. The Proposal shall include:

- A unit price for each item (omitting digits more than four (4) places to the right of the decimal point)
- An extension for each unit price (omitting digits more than two (2) places to the right of the decimal point)
- The total Contract price (the sum of all extensions)

**SIGNATURES:** Bids shall be signed by one of the legally authorized officers of said corporation. If awarded the contract, the Contract shall also be so executed. If a Bid Proposal or Contract is signed by an agent, the agent shall provide satisfactory evidence of authority to sign as legal representative of Bidder, upon request of Skagit County. An authorized partner of a co-partnership may sign the contract, subject to the approval of the attorney, who may at his discretion, require each and every member of the co-partnership to sign the contract.

**DELIVERY OF PROPOSAL:** Sealed bids will be received by the Board of Skagit County Commissioners. Bids must be received no later than 2:30 p.m. on **Monday, September 23, 2024** according to the SKAGIT COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' reception desk clock. All bid envelopes must be plainly marked on the outside, "<u>Sealed Bid: Nookachamps Creek Riparian Restoration</u>," and delivered to the address below.

It is the Contractor's responsibility to allow enough time for delivery to occur before the designated time. Quotations delivered to locations other than as indicated above or received after the designated time will not be accepted. Incomplete proposals cannot be considered. Oral, telephonic, telegraphic, electronic, or faxed proposals will not be accepted.

Skagit County reserves the right to reject any or all bids, waive informalities, and make the award in the best interest of Skagit County. Quotation results and questions pertaining to this project can be obtained by calling Emily Derenne, Habitat Restoration Project Manager, at 360-416-1449. Bids remain confidential and no information about bids is released until the public information of the bids is otherwise available.

The Contracting Agency will not open or consider any Proposal when the Proposal or Bid deposit is received after the time specified for receipt of Proposals or received in a location other than that specified for receipt of Proposals unless an emergency or unanticipated event interrupts normal work processes of the Contracting Agency so that Proposals cannot be received.

If an emergency or unanticipated event interrupts normal work processes of the Contracting Agency so that Proposals cannot be received at the office designated for receipt of bids as specified above the time specified for receipt of the Proposal will be deemed to be extended to the same time of day specified in the solicitation on the first work day on which the normal work processes of the Contracting Agency resume.

**BID BOND DEPOSIT/GUARANTY:** Pursuant to Title 36.32.250 RCW, no bid will be considered unless accompanied by a surety company bid bond, Cashier's or certified check payable to the order of Skagit County for a sum not less than five percent (5%) of the estimated bid amount. Should the successful Bidder fail to enter into such contract, the bid bond will be forfeited to Skagit County.

Any proposal bond shall be on a form acceptable to the Contracting Agency and shall be signed by the Bidder and the Surety. A proposal bond shall not be conditioned in any way to modify the minimum five percent (5%) required. The Surety shall: (1) be registered with the Washington State Insurance Commissioner, and (2) appear on the current Authorized Insurance List in the State of Washington published by the Office of the Insurance Commissioner.

The failure to furnish a Bid deposit of a minimum of five percent (5%) with the Bid or as a physical supplement to the electronic Proposal Form shall make the Bid nonresponsive and shall cause the Bid to be rejected by the Contracting Agency.

**NON-COLLUSION:** Submittal and signature of the non-collusion certificate confirms the Bid is genuine and not a sham or collusive, and not made in the interest of any person not named, and that the Contractor has not induced or solicited others to submit a sham offer, or to refrain from proposing.

**CONSIDERATION OF BIDS:** After opening and reading Proposals, the Contracting Agency will check them for correctness of extensions of the prices per unit and the total price. If a discrepancy exists between the price per unit and the extended amount of any bid item, the price per unit will control. The total of extensions, corrected where necessary, will be used by the Contracting Agency for Award purposes and to fix the amount of the Contract Bond.

The right is reserved by the Contracting Agency to waive informalities in the bidding, accept a Proposal of the lowest responsible Bidder, reject any or all Bids, republish the call for Bids, revise or cancel the Work, or require the Work to be done in another way, if the best interest of the Contracting Agency is served.

A Bidder who wishes to claim error after the Bids have been opened and read as required by Title 47.28.090 RCW shall promptly notify the Contracting Agency that an error occurred. The Bidder shall submit a notarized affidavit or declaration under penalty of perjury signed by the Bidder and accompanied by the work sheets used in the preparation of the Bid, requesting relief from the responsibilities of Award. The affidavit or declaration shall describe the specific error(s) and certify that the work sheets are the ones used in preparing the Bid.

The affidavit or declaration shall be submitted no later than 4:30 p.m. on the first business day after Bid opening (Tuesday, September 24, 2024) or the claim will not be considered. The Contracting Agency will review the affidavit or declaration and the certified work sheets to determine the validity of the claimed error and if the error is of the kind for which the law allows relief from forfeiture of the Bid deposit. If the Contracting Agency concurs in the claim of error and determines that the error is of the kind which allows relief from forfeiture, the Bidder will be relieved of responsibility and the Bid deposit of the Bidder will be returned. If the Contracting Agency does not concur in the error or determines that the error is not the kind for which the law allows relief, the Contracting Agency may Award the Contract and if the Bidder refuses to execute the Contract, the Bidder's Bid deposit shall be forfeited as required by Title 47.28.100 RCW. Title 39.04.107 RCW applies, thereafter.

**NON-RESPONSIVE BIDS:** Any Bid that does not comply with these instructions, is not signed, supplements or deviates from the specifications herein, or is incomplete, may be declared non-responsive by Skagit County and not further considered.

**PROTESTS:** Protests will be in accordance with all RCWs, as applicable.

### CONTRACT

**EXECUTION OF CONTRACT:** Successful Bidder is allowed a maximum of **ten (10)** calendar days after the award date to return the signed contract, contract bond, all required insurance certifications, and any other required documentation as specified in this document.

Until the Contracting Agency executes a Contract, no Proposal shall bind the Contracting Agency nor shall any Work begin within the project limits or within Contracting Agency-furnished sites. The Contractor shall bear all risks for any Work begun outside such areas and for any materials ordered before the Contract is executed by the Contracting Agency.

If the Bidder experiences circumstances beyond their control that prevents return of the Contract documents within ten (10) calendar days after the Award date, the Contracting Agency may grant up to a maximum of ten (10) additional calendar days for return of the documents, provided the Contracting Agency deems the circumstances warrant it.

**CONTRACT DOCUMENTS:** The Addenda, Bid Proposal, General and Contract Provisions and Specifications, and Contract, shall be a part of and constitute the Contract entered into by Skagit County and successful Bidder. In the event there is discrepancy between any of the foregoing contract documents, the above order of documents governs so that the former prevails over the latter.

**CONTRACT BOND:** Pursuant to Title 39.08 RCW, the successful Bidder shall provide an executed contract bond for the full contract amount. This contract bond shall:

1. Be on a Contracting Agency-furnished form;

- 2. Be signed by an approved Surety (or Sureties) that:
  - a. Is registered with the Washington State Insurance Commissioner, and
  - b. Appears on the current Authorized Insurance List in the State of Washington published by the Office of the Insurance Commissioner,
- 3. Be conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract by the Contractor within the prescribed time;
- 4. Guarantee that the Surety shall indemnify, defend, and protect the Contracting Agency against any claim of direct or indirect loss resulting from the failure:
  - a. Of the Contractor (or any of the employees, subcontractors, or lower tier subcontractors of the Contractor) to faithfully perform the contract, or
  - b. Of the Contractor (or the subcontractors or lower tier subcontractors of the Contractor) to pay all laborers, mechanics, subcontractors, lower tier subcontractors, material or any other person who provides supplies or provisions for carrying out the work;

The Contracting Agency may require Sureties or Surety companies on the Contract Bond to appear and qualify themselves. Whenever the Contracting Agency deems the Surety or Sureties to be inadequate, it may, upon written demand, require the Contractor to furnish additional Surety to cover any remaining work. Until the added Surety is furnished, payments on the Contract will stop.

**RETAINAGE:** Pursuant to Title 60.28 RCW, a sum of five percent (5%) of the monies earned by the Contractor will be retained from progress estimates. Such retainage shall be used as a trust fund for the protection and payment (1) to the State with respect to taxes imposed pursuant to Title 82 RCW, and (2) the claims of any person arising under the Contract.

Monies retained under the provisions of Title 60.28 RCW shall, at the option of the Contractor, be:

- 1. Retained in a fund by the Contracting Agency; or
- 2. Deposited by the Contracting Agency in an escrow (interest-bearing) account in a bank, mutual saving bank, or savings and loan association (interest on monies so retained shall be paid to the Contractor). Deposits are to be in the name of the Contracting Agency and are not to be allowed to be withdrawn without the Contracting Agency's written authorization. The Contracting Agency will issue a check representing the sum of the monies reserved, payable to the bank or trust company. Such check shall be converted into bonds and securities chosen by the Contractor as the interest accrues.

At the time the Contract is executed the Contractor shall designate the option desired. The Contractor in choosing option (2) agrees to assume full responsibility to pay all costs that may accrue from escrow services, brokerage charges or both, and further agrees to assume all risks in connection with the investment of the retained percentages in securities. The Contracting Agency may also, at its option, accept a bond in lieu of retainage.

Release of the retainage will be made sixty (60) days following the Completion Date (pursuant to Title 39.12 RCW, and Title 60.28 RCW) provided the following conditions are met:

- 1. On Contracts totaling more than \$35,000, a release has been obtained from the Washington State Department of Revenue.
- 2. Affidavits of Wages Paid for the Contractor and all Subcontractors are on file with the Contracting Agency (Title 39.12.040 RCW).

- 3. A certificate of Payment of Contributions Penalties and Interest on Public Works Contract is received from the Washington State Employment Security Department.
- 4. Washington State Department of Labor and Industries (in accordance with Section 1-07.10) shows the Contractor is current with payments of industrial insurance and medical aid premiums.
- 5. All claims, as provided by law, filed against the retainage have been resolved. In the event claims are filed and provided the conditions of 1, 2, 3, and 4 are met, the Contractor will be paid such retained percentage less an amount sufficient to pay any such claims together with a sum determined by the Contracting Agency sufficient to pay the cost of foreclosing on claims and to cover attorney's fees.

**INSURANCE:** Contractor shall comply with the following conditions and procure and keep in force during the term of this Agreement, at Contractor's own cost and expense, the following policies of insurance with companies authorized to do business in the State of Washington, which are rated at least "A" or better and with a numerical rating of no less than seven (7), by A.M. Best Company and which are acceptable to the County.

- 1. <u>Commercial General Liability Insurance</u> on an occurrence basis in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and at least \$1,000,000 in the annual aggregate, including but not limited to: premises/operations (including off-site operations), blanket contractual liability and broad form property damage.
- 2. <u>Business Automobile Liability Insurance</u> in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, extending to any automobile.
- <u>Workers' Compensation Insurance</u> as required by Washington law and <u>Employer's</u> <u>Liability Insurance (Stop Gap)</u> with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. If the County authorizes sublet work, the Contractor shall require each Subcontractor to provide Workers' Compensation Insurance for its employees, unless the Contractor covers such employees.

The above liability policies shall contain a provision that the policy shall not be canceled or materially changed without thirty (30) days prior written notice to the County. No cancellation provision in any insurance policy shall be construed in derogation of the continuous duty of the Contractor to furnish the required insurance during the term of this Agreement.

Upon written request by the County, the insurer or his/her agent will furnish, prior to or during any Work being performed, a copy of any policy cited above, certified to be a true and complete copy of the original.

**ADDITIONAL INSURED:** Prior to the Contractor performing any Work, Contractor shall provide the County with a Certificate of Insurance acceptable to the County Risk Manager evidencing the above-required insurance and naming Skagit County, its officers, employees and agents as Additional Insureds on the Commercial General Liability Insurance policy and the Business Automobile Liability Insurance policy with respect to the operations performed and services provided under this Agreement and that such insurance shall apply as primary insurance on behalf of such Additional Insureds. Skagit County and Clear Valley Environmental (the landowner) shall be named as an Additional Insured by endorsement using ISO Form CG 2010 or equivalent. Receipt by the County of any certificate showing less coverage than required is not a waiver of the Contractor's obligations to fulfill the requirement.

The Certificate must name the County as additional insured, and state: Skagit County, its elected officials, officers and employees are named as additional insured. Clear Valley Environmental is also named as additional insured.

The insurance policies required in this Contract are to contain and be endorsed to contain the following provisions:

With respect to all Liability Policies:

Skagit County its officers, officials, employees, and agents and volunteers are named as additional insured's as respects liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the Contractor in connection with this Contract.

The Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects Skagit County, its officers, officials, employees, agents, volunteers and consultants. Any insurance and/or self-insurance maintained by Skagit County, its officers, officials, employees, agents and consultants shall not contribute with the Contractor's insurance or benefit the Contractor in any way.

An additional insureds endorsement template can be provided by Skagit County, upon request.

#### PUBLIC WORKS PROJECT – PREVAILING WAGE:

Pursuant to Title 39.12 RCW, if awarded the project, the Contractor and each Subcontractor shall complete or have on file with the County a current "Statement of Intent to Pay Prevailing Wages" before payment will be made for work performed. An "Affidavit of Wages Paid" shall be required at the end of the project, before final payment is authorized. These forms are available from Washington State Department of Labor & Industries and can be filed electronically at http://www.lni.wa.gov/TradesLicensing/PrevWage.

The State of Washington prevailing wage rates applicable for this public works project, which is located in Skagit County, may be found at the following website address of the Department of Labor and Industries: <u>https://fortress.wa.gov/lni/wagelookup/prvWagelookup.aspx.</u>

Any materials purchased will be used in public work type projects as defined in RCW 39.12, and therefore, subject to state prevailing wage rates as set forth by the Washington Department of Labor and Industries. Bidders are advised to consider this charge when computing bids.

**LICENSES AND PERMITS:** Contractor shall procure all licenses, pay all charges, fees and taxes, and give all notices necessary and incidental to the due and lawful prosecution of the work. Contractors awarded a County Contract are responsible for compliance with Washington State Business License regulations.

**CHANGES/AMENDMENTS:** Skagit County reserves the right to add or delete work, items, agencies, or locations from this contract, subject to appropriate adjustments to the Contract price. Added items, agencies, or locations will be related to those on contract, and additions or deletions will be by mutual agreement, with prices consistent with the original bid price margins, and evidenced by an amendment to the Contract. The execution of an amendment shall constitute a waiver of Claims by the Contractor arising out of the Work to be performed or deleted pursuant to the amendment, except as specifically described in the amendment. General reservations of rights will be deemed waived and void.

**FAILURE TO EXECUTE CONTRACT**: Upon failure to return the performance and payment bonds, insurance certifications, and any other required documentation as specified in this document with the signed contract, as required, Skagit County may then award the contract to the second lowest responsive and responsible Bidder, or reject all remaining bids.

#### **RETURN OF BID BOND/GUARANTY:**

Proposal bonds and deposits will be held until the Contract has been properly executed pursuant to Title 36.32.250 RCW. When the Contract has been properly executed, all remaining bonds or deposits, except those subject to forfeiture, will be returned.

## LEGAL RELATIONS AND RESPONSIBILTIES TO THE PUBLIC

**COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS:** Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, tribal and local laws, rules, and regulations affecting its performance and hold Skagit County harmless against any claims arising from the violation thereof. No extension of time or additional payment will be made for loss of time or disruption of work caused by any actions against the Contractor for any of the above reasons.

**APPLICATION OF SALES TAX:** The work on this contract is to be performed upon lands whose ownership obligates the Contractor to pay State sales tax. Department of Revenue Rule 171 applies to this project. This work is not exempt from Sales Tax. The contractor shall include appropriate sales tax as shown on the Bid Proposal. The Contracting Agency will not adjust its payment if the Contractor bases a bid on a misunderstood tax liability.

**DEFENSE & INDEMNITY AGREEMENT:** The Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless the County, its appointed and elective officers and employees, from and against all loss or expense, including but not limited to judgments, settlements, attorney's fees and costs by reason of any and all claims and demands upon the County, its elected or appointed officials or employees for damages because of personal or bodily injury, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons and on account of damage to property including loss of use thereof, whether such injury to persons or damage to property is due to the negligence of the Contractor, its subcontractors, its elected officers, employees or their agents, except only such injury or damage as shall have been occasioned by the sole negligence of the County, its appointed officials or employees. It is further provided that no liability shall attach to the County by reason of entering into this contract, except as expressly provided herein.

**HOLD HARMLESS:** The Contractor shall hold Skagit County and its officers, agents and employees harmless from all costs, claims or liabilities of any nature including attorneys; fees, costs and expenses for or on account of injuries or damages sustained by any persons or property resulting from the negligent activities or omissions of the Contractor, its agents or employees pursuant to the Contract, or on account of any unpaid wages or other remuneration for services; and if a suit as described above be filed, the Contractor shall appear and defend the same at its own cost and expense, and if judgment be rendered or settlement made requiring payment by Skagit County, the Contractor shall pay the same.

**TERMINATION FOR PUBLIC CONVENIENCE:** The County may terminate the Contract in whole or in part whenever the County determines, in its sole discretion that such termination is in the best interests of the County. Whenever the contract is terminated in accordance with this paragraph, the Contractor shall be entitled to payment for actual work performed at unit contract

prices for completed items of work. An equitable adjustment in the contract price for partially completed items of work will be made, but such adjustment shall not include provision for loss of anticipated profit on deleted or uncompleted work. Termination of this contract by the County at any time during the term, whether for default or convenience, shall not constitute a breach of contract by the County. If sufficient funds are not appropriated or allocated for payment under this contract for any future fiscal period, the County will not be obligated to make payments for services or amounts incurred after the end of the current fiscal period. No penalty or expense shall accrue to the County in the event this provision applies.

## PAYMENT

**INVOICES:** The Contractor shall be paid, upon submission of a proper invoice for payment request, the prices stipulated in the Contract for services performed (less deductions, if any), in accordance with all payment and retainage instructions herein. All accounts are paid according to Title 39.76 RCW. Submitted Payment Requests must contain the following minimum information:

- Contract number;
- Item number, quantity, and description as appropriate;
- Unit and extended prices.
- Approved Intent of Wages Paid with WA Department of Labor and Industries

Payments are to be submitted no more than monthly, but not less than quarterly.

Payment will be made to the Contractor upon completion of all work and after final inspection and acceptance of the work by the Owner's Representative.

## SCOPE OF WORK

This service consists of the completion of a site plan as described below and planting with native vegetation to restore native species and ecological functions to this riparian area. The project area is located along the East Fork of Nookachamps Creek near Mount Vernon, WA (Figure 2). Due to the duration of project funding under the Voluntary Stewardship Program, all planting needs to be completed by Monday, March 31, 2025 and therefore there may not be sufficient time for "typical" site preparation such as spraying herbicide. Due to the condensed timeline the Contracting Agency has secured fourteen thousand seven hundred fifty (14,750) bareroot and livestake plants to be used toward the Project. As described below, the Contractor shall provide a list of additional plants and site plan for riparian restoration to the Contracting Agency for approval before beginning any work.

#### SITE DESCRIPTION

The Nookachamps restoration site is located near Mount Vernon in Skagit County, Washington in Sections 10 and 11, Township 34 North, Range 04 East, (Figure 2). The Project site is within a privately owned 396-acre property known as <u>Skagit Environmental Wetland Mitigation Bank</u>. The

Project area is approximately seventeen (17) acres and begins at the upstream (eastern) property line and extends west/downstream to the western-most bridge located approximately three thousand one hundred fifty (3,150) feet downstream of the eastern property line (Figure 2).

Both the Skagit River and Nookachamps Creek frequently flood the Project area. The Project area is located within the lower Skagit River in one of the few remaining areas that does not have flood protection dikes. Historically, agricultural drainage ditches were installed; however, drainage is slow and the soils remain saturated for long periods of time. The riparian area currently consists of an approximately 100-foot-wide corridor dominated by reed canary grass and blackberry with the occasional native woody species such as Black Cottonwood, Nootka Rose, willows, and Red Alder. Beyond this corridor, the area is maintained for agricultural production. The intent of the Mitigation Bank is to replant the entire agricultural area though this work is not expected soon.

#### SITE ACCESS

Access to the site will be granted upon award of the Contract. The access driveway is located to the south of the project site off State Route 9. There is a bridge on the western edge of the property for access to the northern portion of the site. Storage of equipment may occur on site though the Bidder must consider the site conditions and weather forecast. Damage to equipment or materials left on site will be the responsibility of the Contractor and considered incidental to work performed.

#### SITE PLAN

The Contractor shall develop a restoration site plan to be approved by the Contracting Agency. The restoration site plan will include a Weed and Pest Control Plan and a Plant Establishment Plan as described in Section 8-02.3(2), unless superseded here. Specific planting density and other technical details in the restoration site plan shall be guided by and cite the references listed in Table 1. As described in the Site Plantings section below, plantings shall have an average density of eight (8) feet on center and be a mixture of shrubs, hardwoods, and coniferous trees. The Contracting Agency has secured fourteen thousand seven hundred fifty (14,750) plants (Table 2) for use in the Project. The Contractor shall complete the Site Plan using the secured plants, if deemed desirable, and referencing the list of Recommended Species below. The area shown in Figure 3 shall be planted with those species that handle disturbance well, such as willows and other livestakes.

#### SITE PREPARATION

Due to the nature of the awarded funding, "typical" site preparation involving multiple weed treatments prior to planting is not possible. The site is currently dominated by reed canary grass with some patches of blackberry and other invasive vegetation, pasture grasses, and native plants including cottonwood, willow, and Nootka rose (Figures 4-6).

The Contractor is permitted to use herbicides to treat invasive vegetation **but** must avoid direct contact with water and existing native vegetation. Care must also be taken to ensure the survival of newly planted vegetation when using herbicides. Specific names and formulations of herbicides and surfactants proposed for use must be included in the Site Plan. Chemicals must always be applied as directed by the label at the minimum concentration needed for efficacy. The Contractor must notify the Contracting Agency at least forty-eight (48) hours before any herbicide application. The herbicide applicator must be licensed in Washington State for work in and around water and terrestrial environments. The Contractor must follow Environmental Protection Agency guidelines on appropriate herbicides for fish-bearing streams and adhere to section 8-02.3(2)B of the Standard Specifications.

The Contractor will collaborate with the Contracting Agency if non-vegetative debris or trash is found on site and needs removal. If the debris hinders the Contractor's work progress, the Contracting Agency will remove it within five (5) business days of notification by the Contractor. If feasible, the Contractor may move the debris to continue work and create a pile for later pick-up. When possible, the Contractor should place this pile outside the project area and adjacent to the driveway for easy accessibility. When notifying the Contracting Agency, the Contractor must specify whether the debris needs immediate removal to continue work or has been set aside for later pick-up.

#### SITE PLANTINGS

The entire area is approximately seventeen (17) acres. The waterward approximately two (2) acres and an area identified as a relic swale approximately two (2) acres require four (4) feet on center plant density while the remaining thirteen (13) acres will have an average density of eight (8) feet on center. Assuming all seventeen (17) acres can be planted we expect approximately eighteen thousand five hundred ninety (18,590) plants to be installed. All plants shall be planted by Monday, March 31, 2025. Plantings shall loosely follow the planting plan outlined in Appendix A. All plantings shall be native riparian vegetation (see "recommended species" below), with seed provenance appropriate to the region of planting. Species selection shall be a mixture of conifers, hardwoods, and shrubs, and may include robust herbaceous wetland species. To ensure the resilience of the native plant community, the riparian species selection shall be as diverse as possible and include a minimum of three (3) species of hardwoods and four (4) species of shrubs. Though bareroot planting is expected, plants shall not be root-bound when planted if sourced from potted stock. The project site routinely experiences flooding so selected species shall be known to tolerate these conditions. Any willows or other species planted as live stakes need to be a minimum of thirty-six inches (36") in length and three eights of an inch (3/8") in diameter, and planted at a density of four (4) feet on center, and to a depth of at least half of the live stake length. Plantings will follow guidelines and specifications listed in the Site Plan section above.

Plant material provided in containers shall not be removed from the containers until the time of planting at the planting location. The plant material shall be handled in such a manner that the root systems are kept covered and damp at all times. The root systems of all bareroot or containerized plants shall be moist at the time of planting. In their final position, all plants shall have their top true root (not adventitious root) no more than one inch (1") below the soil surface, no matter where that root was in the original container.

Planting shall not occur during unsuitable soil or weather conditions as determined by the Project Manager. For example, prior to planting, on-site soil moisture must be determined sufficient to support new transplants. Under no circumstances will planting during freezing weather or in frozen ground be permitted. The Project Manager and / or the property Representative may be contacted to provide directions to the planting crew during the planting process. This may include being present on site occasionally.

Upon completion of the planting, the Project Manager and property Representative will inspect all plant material and notify the Contractor, in writing, of any replacements or corrective action necessary to meet the Contract Provisions. The Contractor shall replace all materials rejected or missing and correct unsatisfactory conditions.

Completion of the initial planting within a designated area includes the following:

- 1. One hundred percent (100%) of each of the plant material categories shall be installed as shown in the approved Site Plan.
- 2. Planting area clean-up: Area shall be free from removed vegetation, debris created during construction, and/or any other items not required for the Project functionality.
- 3. Approval of the plant establishment plan for the initial planting.

The Bid item for planting is based on the estimate of an approximate 17-acre planting area with an average plant density of eight feet (8) on center. The plant selection has been assigned based on the percentage break-down detailed above. The quantity for initial planting has been entered into the Proposal only to provide a common proposal for Bidders. Actual quantities will be determined by the approved site plan, and will be paid at the original bid price per plant, regardless of final quantity. This bid item shall not be subject to the provisions of 1-04.6 of the Standard Specifications.

#### **RECOMMENDED SPECIES**

Hardwoods: red alder, big-leaf Maple, vine maple, Oregon ash, black cottonwood, cascara Shrubs: Indian plum, Nootka Rose, red-osier dogwood, salmonberry, twinberry, Pacific ninebark Sensitive Areas: willow species, red-osier dogwood, Douglas's spiraea, panicled bulrush Conifers: western red cedar, Sitka spruce, shore pine, Douglas-fir, western hemlock, grand fir

This is a list of some recommended species, not a list of required species. The Bidder may remove or add species to their list to be approved by the Contracting Agency.

#### SITE MAINTENANCE

Due to project funding deadlines only one (1) round of site maintenance shall be included. This work is to be completed by Friday, May 30, 2025. Maintenance may include herbicide application, mowing, mulching, or hand work as needed to ensure the growth of the transplanted material and that non-native vegetation does not over-top newly planted vegetation. All non-native aggressive species such as blackberry, but not reed canary grass, shall be sprayed during this maintenance period.

Mulching is a common technique used in restoration work. The Contracting Agency will not require mulching. If the Bidder would like to use mulching as a technique in their restoration work, they shall include it in the maintenance portion of the bid. If the Contractor opts to use mulch as a maintenance technique. Mulch shall be placed as follows:

- Feathered to the base of the plant,
- All plant crowns shall remain free of mulch and no mulch shall be in contact with plant stems, and
- Mulch placed to a thickness greater than described in the approved site plan shall be at no additional cost to the Contracting Agency.

#### PAYMENT FOR PLANTING

The unit Contract price for "Purchase and Installation of \_\_\_\_\_\_", per plant, shall be full pay for materials, labor, tools, equipment and supplies necessary for planting, cultivation, plant storage and protection, staking, and clean-up necessary to complete the planting operations as specified.

The unit Contract price for "Installation of \_\_\_\_\_", per plant, shall be full pay for labor, tools, equipment and supplies necessary for planting, cultivation, plant storage and protection, staking, and clean-up necessary to complete the planting operations as specified. Plants shall be provided by the Contracting Agency.

#### **Overtime Codes**

**Overtime calculations** are based on the hourly rate actually paid to the worker. On public works projects, the hourly rate must be not less than the prevailing rate of wage minus the hourly rate of the cost of fringe benefits actually provided for the worker.

- 1. ALL HOURS WORKED IN EXCESS OF EIGHT (8) HOURS PER DAY OR FORTY (40) HOURS PER WEEK SHALL BE PAID AT ONE AND ONE-HALF TIMES THE HOURLY RATE OF WAGE.
  - B. All hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - C. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first ten (10) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other overtime hours and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - D. The first two (2) hours before or after a five-eight (8) hour workweek day or a four-ten (10) hour workweek day and the first eight (8) hours worked the next day after either workweek shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All additional hours worked and all worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - E. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first eight (8) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other hours worked Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - F. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first ten (10) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other overtime hours worked, except Labor Day, shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Labor Day shall be paid at three times the hourly rate of wage.
  - G. The first ten (10) hours worked on Saturdays and the first ten (10) hours worked on a fifth calendar weekday in a fourten hour schedule, shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked in excess of ten (10) hours per day Monday through Saturday and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - H. All hours worked on Saturdays (except makeup days if work is lost due to inclement weather conditions or equipment breakdown) shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked Monday through Saturday over twelve (12) hours and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - I. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall also be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - J. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first ten (10) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked over ten (10) hours Monday through Saturday, Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - K. All hours worked on Saturdays and Sundays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - M. All hours worked on Saturdays (except makeup days if work is lost due to inclement weather conditions) shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

- 1. N. All hours worked on Saturdays (except makeup days) shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - O. The first ten (10) hours worked on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays, holidays and after twelve (12) hours, Monday through Friday and after ten (10) hours on Saturday shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - P. All hours worked on Saturdays (except makeup days if circumstances warrant) and Sundays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - Q. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and up to ten (10) hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked in excess of ten (10) hours per day Monday through Saturday and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays (except Christmas day) shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Christmas day shall be paid at two and one-half times the hourly rate of wage.
  - R. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at two times the hourly rate of wage.
  - U. All hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays (except Labor Day) shall be paid at two times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Labor Day shall be paid at three times the hourly rate of wage.
  - V. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays (except Thanksgiving Day and Christmas day) shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Thanksgiving Day and Christmas day shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - W. All hours worked on Saturdays and Sundays (except make-up days due to conditions beyond the control of the employer)) shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - X. The first four (4) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first twelve (12) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked over twelve (12) hours Monday through Saturday, Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. When holiday falls on Saturday or Sunday, the day before Saturday, Friday, and the day after Sunday, Monday, shall be considered the holiday and all work performed shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - Y. All hours worked outside the hours of 5:00 am and 5:00 pm (or such other hours as may be agreed upon by any employer and the employee) and all hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day (10 hours per day for a 4 x 10 workweek) and on Saturdays and holidays (except labor day) shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. (except for employees who are absent from work without prior approval on a scheduled workday during the workweek shall be paid at the straight-time rate until they have worked 8 hours in a day (10 in a 4 x 10 workweek) or 40 hours during that workweek.) All hours worked Monday through Saturday over twelve (12) hours and all hours worked on Sundays and Labor Day shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - Z. All hours worked on Saturdays and Sundays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid the straight time rate of pay in addition to holiday pay.

All work performed after 6:00 pm Saturday to 5:00 am Monday and Holidays, and all hours worked in excess of twelve (12) hours in a single shift shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

After an employee has worked eight (8) hours at an applicable overtime rate, all additional hours shall be at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours or more. When an employee returns to work without at least eight (8) hours time off since their previous shift, all such time shall be a continuation of shift and paid at the applicable overtime rate until he/she shall have the eight (8) hours rest period.

#### **Overtime Codes Continued**

## 4. ALL HOURS WORKED IN EXCESS OF EIGHT (8) HOURS PER DAY OR FORTY (40) HOURS PER WEEK SHALL BE PAID AT ONE AND ONE-HALF TIMES THE HOURLY RATE OF WAGE.

- A. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day or forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage
- C. On Monday through Friday, the first four (4) hours of overtime after eight (8) hours of straight time work shall be paid at one and one half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate of pay, unless a four (4) day ten (10) hour workweek has been established. On a four (4) day ten (10) hour workweek scheduled Monday through Thursday, or Tuesday through Friday, the first two (2) hours of overtime after ten (10) hours of straight time work shall be paid at one and one half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate of pay. On Saturday, the first twelve (12) hours of work shall be paid at one and one half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate of pay, except that if the job is down on Monday through Friday due to weather conditions or other conditions outside the control of the employer, the first ten (10) hours on Saturday may be worked at the straight time rate of pay. All hours worked over twelve (12) hours in a day and all hours worked on Sunday and Holidays shall be paid at two (2) times the straight time rate of pay.
- D. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day or forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Saturday, Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of pay. Rates include all members of the assigned crew.

#### EXCEPTION:

On all multipole structures and steel transmission lines, switching stations, regulating, capacitor stations, generating plants, industrial plants, associated installations and substations, except those substations whose primary function is to feed a distribution system, will be paid overtime under the following rates:

The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday of overtime on a regular workday, shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours in excess of ten (10) hours will be at two (2) times the hourly rate of wage. The first eight (8) hours worked on Saturday will be paid at one and one-half (1-1/2) times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours on Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays will be at the double the hourly rate of wage.

All overtime eligible hours performed on the above described work that is energized, shall be paid at the double the hourly rate of wage.

E. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first eight (8) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other hours worked Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

On a four-day, ten-hour weekly schedule, either Monday thru Thursday or Tuesday thru Friday schedule, all hours worked after ten shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. The Monday or Friday not utilized in the normal fourday, ten hour work week, and Saturday shall be paid at one and one half (1½) times the regular shift rate for the first eight (8) hours. All other hours worked Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

- G. All hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked Monday through Saturday over twelve (12) hours and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- I. The First eight (8) hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) per day on Saturdays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

#### **Overtime Codes Continued**

- 4. J. The first eight (8) hours worked on a Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours on a Saturday shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked over twelve (12) in a day, and all hours worked on Sundays and Holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - K. All hours worked on a Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage, so long as Saturday is the sixth consecutive day worked. All hours worked over twelve (12) in a day Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and Holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
  - L. The first twelve (12) hours worked on a Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on a Saturday in excess of twelve (12) hours shall be paid at double the hourly rate of pay. All hours worked over twelve (12) in a day Monday through Friday, and all hours worked on Sundays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on a holiday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage, except that all hours worked on Labor Day shall be paid at double the hourly rate of pay.
  - S. On a four (4) day ten (10) hour workweek scheduled Monday through Thursday, or Tuesday through Friday, work performed in excess of (10) hours shall be paid at one and one half (1-1/2) times the hourly rate of pay. On Monday through Friday, work performed outside the normal work hours of 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. shall be paid at one and one-half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate, (except for special shifts or multiple shift operations).

All hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All work performed on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. When an employee returns to work without at least eight (8) hours time off since their previous shift, all such time shall be a continuation of shift and paid at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours.

Multiple Shift Operations: When the first shift of a multiple shift (a two or three shift) operation is started at the basic straight time rate or at a specific overtime rate, all shifts of that day's operation shall be completed at that rate. Special Shifts: The Special Shift Premium is the basic hourly rate of pay plus \$2.00 an hour. When due to conditions beyond the control of the employer or when an owner (not acting as the contractor), a government agency or the contract specifications require more than four (4) hours of a special shift can only be performed outside the normal 6am to 6pm shift then the special shift premium will be applied to the basic straight time for the entire shift. When an employee works on a special shift, they shall be paid the special shift premium for each hour worked unless they are in overtime or double-time status. (For example, the special shift premium does not waive the overtime requirements for work performed on Saturday or Sunday).

U. The first four (4) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first twelve (12) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. (Except on makeup days if work is lost due to inclement weather, then the first eight (8) hours on Saturday may be paid the regular rate.) All hours worked over twelve (12) hours Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

#### **Overtime Codes Continued**

4. X. All hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. Work performed outside the normal shift of 6 am to 6pm shall be paid at one and one-half the straight time rate, (except for special shifts or three shift operations). All work performed on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. Shifts may be established when considered necessary by the Employer.

The Employer may establish shifts consisting of eight (8) or ten (10) hours of work (subject to WAC 296-127-022), that shall constitute a normal forty (40) hour work week. The Employer can change from a 5-eight to a 4-ten hour schedule or back to the other. All hours of work on these shifts shall be paid for at the straight time hourly rate. Work performed in excess of eight hours (or ten hours per day (subject to WAC 296-127-022) shall be paid at one and one-half the straight time rate.

When due to conditions beyond the control of the Employer, or when contract specifications require that work can only be performed outside the regular day shift, then by mutual agreement a special shift may be worked at the straight time rate, eight (8) hours work for eight (8) hours pay. The starting time shall be arranged to fit such conditions of work.

When an employee returns to work without at a break of eight (8) hours since their previous shift, all such time shall be a continuation of shift and paid at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours.

## 11. ALL HOURS WORKED IN EXCESS OF EIGHT (8) HOURS PER DAY OR FORTY (40) HOURS PER WEEK SHALL BE PAID AT ONE AND ONE-HALF TIMES THE HOURLY RATE OF WAGE.

The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday, the first ten (10) hours on Saturday, and the first ten (10) hours worked on Holidays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked over ten (10) hours Monday through Saturday, and Sundays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

After an employee has worked eight (8) hours, all additional hours worked shall be paid at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours or more.

11. F. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first eight (8) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other hours worked Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

On a four-day, ten-hour weekly schedule, either Monday thru Thursday or Tuesday thru Friday schedule, all hours worked after ten shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All work performed after 6:00 pm Saturday to 5:00 am Monday and Holidays, and all hours worked in excess of twelve (12) hours in a single shift shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

After an employee has worked eight (8) hours at an applicable overtime rate, all additional hours shall be at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of nine (9) hours or more. When an employee returns to work without at least nine (9) hours time off since their previous shift, all such time shall be a continuation of shift and paid at the applicable overtime rate until he/she shall have the nine (9) hours rest period.

H. Work performed in excess of eight (8) hours of straight time per day, or ten (10) hours of straight time per day when four ten (10) hour shifts are established, or forty (40) hours of straight time per week, Monday through Friday, or outside the normal 5 am to 6pm shift, and all work on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage.

All work performed after 6:00 pm Saturday to 5:00 am Monday and Holidays, and all hours worked in excess of twelve (12) hours in a single shift shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

After an employee has worked eight (8) hours at an applicable overtime rate, all additional hours shall be at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of ten (10) hours or more. When an employee returns to work without at least ten (10) hours time off since their previous shift, all such time shall be a continuation of shift and paid at the applicable overtime rate until he/she shall have the ten (10) hours rest period.

- J. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- K. On Monday through Friday hours worked outside 4:00 am and 5:00 pm, and the first two (2) hours after eight (8) hours worked shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate. All hours worked over 10 hours per day Monday through Friday, and all hours worked on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays worked shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- L. An employee working outside 5:00 am and 5:00 pm shall receive an additional two dollar (\$2.00) per hour for all hours worked that shift. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage.

#### **Overtime Codes Continued**

11. M. On Monday through Friday, the first four (4) hours of overtime after eight (8) hours of straight time work shall be paid at one and one half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate of pay, unless a four (4) day ten (10) hour workweek has been established. On a four (4) day ten (10) hour workweek scheduled Monday through Thursday, or Tuesday through Friday, the first two (2) hours of overtime after ten (10) hours of straight time work shall be paid at one and one half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate of pay.

Work performed outside the normal work hours of 5:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. shall be paid at one and one-half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate, (except for special shifts or multiple shift operations). When the first shift of a multiple shift (a two or three shift) operation is started at the basic straight time rate or at a specific overtime rate, all shifts of that day's operation shall be completed at that rate. When due to conditions beyond the control of the Employer or when contract specifications require that work can only be performed outside the regular day shift of 5:00 am to 6:00 pm, then a special shift may be worked at the straight time rate, plus the shift pay premium when applicable. The starting time of work will be arranged to fit such conditions of work. Such shift shall consist of eight (8) hours work for eight (8) hours pay or ten (10) hours work for ten (10) hours pay for four ten shifts.

On Saturday, the first twelve (12) hours of work shall be paid at one and one half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate of pay. All work performed after 6:00 pm Saturday to 5:00 am Monday, all work performed over twelve (12) hours, and all work performed on holidays shall be paid at double the straight time rate of pay.

Shift Pay Premium: In an addition to any overtime already required, all hours worked between the hours of 6:00 pm and 5:00 am shall receive an additional two dollars (\$2.00) per hour.

N. All work performed over twelve hours in a shift and all work performed on Sundays and Holidays shall be paid at double the straight time rate.

Any time worked over eight (8) hours on Saturday shall be paid double the straight time rate, except employees assigned to work six 10-hour shifts per week shall be paid double the straight time rate for any time worked on Saturday over 10 hours.

O. All work performed on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays shall be paid at one and one half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate of pay.

After an employee has worked eight (8) hours at an applicable overtime rate, all additional hours shall be at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours.

When an employee returns to work without a break of eight (8) hours since their previous shift, all such time shall be a continuation of shift and paid at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours.

- Q. All hours worked between the hours of 6:00 pm and 6:00 am, Monday through Saturday, shall be paid at a premium rate of 35% over the hourly rate of wage. Work performed on Sundays shall be paid at double time. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- R On Monday through Saturday hours worked outside 6:00 am and 7:00 pm, and all hours after eight (8) hours worked shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate. All hours worked on Sundays and Holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

Such Special Shift shall consist of eight (8) hours of work for eight (8) hours of pay or ten (10) hours of work for ten(10) hours of pay on a four-ten workday schedule.
