Autopsies are not performed daily and are scheduled based on the availability of the forensic pathologist. If a participant is interested in observing an autopsy, the Coroner's Office will contact the participant should an opportunity become available.

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PROGRAM ATTIRE AND APPEARANCE POLICY

Purpose:

To provide standards commensurate with professional attire, appearance, and responsibility for participants in Skagit County Coroner's Office educational programs.

Policy:

Participants function under the authority of Coroner personnel. The Coroner's Office expects participants to exhibit respectfulness, maturity, and professionalism. During autopsies, the Coroner's Office expects participants to function under our forensic pathologist's auspices. This office also encounters many outside agencies (law enforcement, EMS, fire, public utilities, medical facilities, social services etc.) during its investigations, and the Coroner's Office expects participants to be mature and conduct themselves commendably with these agencies. The Coroner's Office expects participants to present themselves professionally, in both dress and behavior, and a participant may be dismissed from the program if they fail to do so.

A. Appearance and General Requirements

▪ Appropriate attire

- All participants will wear black cargo-style or tactical pants and a plain black t-shirt or polo shirt.
- For autopsies, all participants must wear scrub shirt and pants.

▪ Unacceptable Attire includes but is not limited to:

- Jeans, sweatpants, sweatshirts, cutoffs or shorts, sheer clothing, low necklines, stretch pants, spaghetti straps, backless attire, casual sandals, or flip flops. No emblems, slogans, symbols, pins, buttons, or insignias (except those that are unobtrusive, like alligators on polo shirts), or anything connotating illicit substances, alcohol, tobacco, obscene language, sex, violence, or discrimination.

▪ Footwear

- Participants must wear either dark colored boots or dark colored closed-toe shoes appropriate for the workplace. Participants cannot wear open-toed or bright colored shoes.

B. Jewelry, Piercings, and Tattoos

- Participants must wear limited jewelry. They cannot have any dangling or large hoop earrings, earplugs/earspools/flesh tunnels, or skin loops as they might create a safety hazard or interfere with the use of personal protective equipment.
- Participants cannot have nose, lip, tongue, or other visible/interfering non-ear piercings.
- Participants must cover or otherwise hide tattoos that others can perceive as offensive and hostile.

C. Responsibility

- Participants must follow this policy while participating in the Skagit County Coroner's Office educational programs. Participants who do not comply with the Coroner's Office policies may be dismissed from the program.
