About The Job

As Public Works Director, you will oversee seven divisions including; administration, engineering, equipment, ferry, natural resources, operations and solid waste. With this is the maintenance and preservation of 900 miles of county roads, more than 115 bridges, a water quality program second to none, the preservation of thousands of acres of farmland, a ferry to Guemes Island, and a modern transfer station handling solid waste. Interlocal agreements with doz-

ens of dike and drainage districts, tribal governments, conservation districts, neighboring counties, cities, towns, and state and federal agencies offers an opportunity for a diverse leadership position.

Our constitutional form of government allows you to work closely with your elected officials on a daily basis while enjoying the small town feel of local government.

Skagit County's Public Works Department is made up of seven divisions with more than 140 employees and an annual budget in excess of \$70 million.

- **Volunteer Stewardship Program:** Oversee work to enhance critical areas on agricultural lands.

- Clean Water Program: Provide leadership to protect thousands of acres of shellfish beds in Puget Sound.
- Salmon Protection: Work to remove fish barriers under County roads. Collaborate with tribes and agencies to restore and enhance fist habitat
- Roads and Bridges: Maintain and preserve more than 900 miles of County roads and 115 bridges.
- Drainage: Enhance collaboration with Skagit County dike, drainage and irrigation districts. Mitigate issues affecting rural residents and agricultural producers.
