Road flares	Household cleaners
Pool & spa supplies	Lawn & garden products
Antifreeze	Latex Paint(<i>PaintCare</i>)

No explosives, ammunition, radioactive materials, fireworks, or asbestos!

- All other chemicals accepted ONLY during HHW Facility Hours.
- All materials, except for oil and antifreeze, must be kept in their containers.
- There is a limit of 25 gallons of household hazardous waste per month.
- Businesses must enroll in our Small Quantity Generator Program, please call 360-416-1580.
- Sharps, syringes, and medication are not accepted. Please call Public Health at 360-416-1500 for disposal information. (revised 9/20/23)
